Parenting is tough! How to get them to sleep? When to give rewards? When to discipline? When to push your children? When to keep quiet? How to best help them along the way? There are so many challenges we face as parents, and they continue long after the nappies have gone. And of course, parenting is the one thing none of us have any training for.

Unlike becoming a potential foster or adoption parent – there are no hoops to jump through before you can have a child. No one checks that you are ready for the task - although to be fair, that is probably just as well, otherwise I suspect there would be very few children born! The majority of us muddle along, trying our best with whatever resources we have.

At Burpham church we recognise that most of us could do with some encouragement and support in this area, and so in January we will be starting a course called Parentalk:

the primary years. Focusing on helping those with children aged 3-10 years, this is a fantastic 7-week course from 'Care for the Family'.

After another successful Firework Fiesta and Torchlight Procession last November we thought it would be a good idea to get to know the Guildford Lions Club a little better and to find out more about their charity fund raising works.

The Lions' motto is 'We Serve'. Much of the focus of the club is to raise money for worthy causes. Members give their time and effort to improving their community, and the world. Lions programs include vision – saving sight, youth development, disaster relief, hunger alleviation, care for the environment, and childhood cancer. Worldwide Lions Clubs have membership of over 1.4 million members in some 46,000 clubs.

At a local level Guildford Lions Club serves the Guildford and neighbouring communities. They have regular fundraising events; including the Easter Fayre at Shalford Park, a charity concert; the Last Night of the Spring Proms at GLive in May, a Raft Race on the River Wey and a Music in the Park event at Hatchlands in July, a 10km, 15km, and fun run at Hatchlands in September and the 'not to be missed' Torchlight Procession and Fireworks display in Stoke Park in November.

In addition to fundraising events the Lions provide assistance to the local community. They put on an annual Afternoon Tea for pensioners, a coach trip for Young Carers, drive blind bowlers to the bowling green and provide PSA testing for Prostate Cancer to name but a few.

Funds raised by Lions Clubs from the general public are only used for charitable purposes. Administrative costs are kept separate and paid for by the membership. New members are always welcome, as are volunteers to help at the fundraising events.





# Things to do in the garden in January.

Check the ground conditions before working in your garden. Trying to work rain sodden soil will do more harm than good, as will trying to plant into frosted ground.

If you only need a few plants it is very often better to buy plug plants in March or to wait until May and then to buy a box of bedding plants from your local nursery.

- Now is the time to study the Plant and Seed catalogues which have been dropping through the letter box on a regular basis. Some points to remember are:
- Plants are quite often grouped together in photographs to catch the eye so that the size of plant that you grow in your own garden may not be as big.

- New varieties of seed can be expensive, look on the back of the packet to see how many seeds you are buying, they can also be difficult to germinate. Remember that this years novelties seeds are next years normal seed.
- If you only need a few plants it is very often better to buy plug plants in March or to wait until May and then to buy a box of bedding plants from your local nursery (the Club will be visiting Elm Nursery in May where you will obtain a discount on all plant purchases).
- Apple and Pear trees can now be pruned, cut away any congested growth to increase airflow and to improve the quality of next seasons fruit, cut back to a fruit bud which is large and rounded and usually on older growth, one year old shoots should be pruned back to a slender bud. Whilst the fruit buds are dormant an oil based product should be applied to kill off overwintering aphids.

# Things to do in the garden in February.

- Top dress flower beds and borders with a balanced fertilizer such as Growmore or Blood, Fish and Bone.
- Start Dahlia tubers into growth in a light warm place to provide cuttings

- for new plants. If your overwintered tubers have shrivelled, put them in a bucket of tepid water over night.
- Plant Lilly bulbs in pots and containers ready for the Summer.
- Sweet Peas should be sown now. Continue to pot on Autumn sown seeds.
- Complete the planting of deciduous hedges, shrubs and trees.
- Prune Mahonias after flowering to encourage branching.
- Cut back Wisteria side-shoots to two or three buds.
- Cut back Autumn and Summer flowering Clematis to the lowest pair of strong buds.
- During mild, dry periods scarify and spike the lawn to improve drainage.
- In the middle of the month you can give your indoor Tomatoes and Cucumbers an early start by sowing the seed at 21°C.
- You can get an early start by sowing Broad Beans, Beetroot and Peas in a prepared bed under cloches.
- Early Potatoes should be chitted in a light, cool, frost free place.
- Slow growing Annuals such as Antirrhinums and Lobelia, should be sown indoors.
- Overwintered Geraniums and Fuchsias can now be brought growth by gradual watering so that they produce new shoots.


