My grandmother was in a Japanese concentration camp (see picture above) and my grandfather captured and sent to work on the Bridge over the River Kwai. At one point, he was left for dead and only survived because locals rescued and fed him. Both were deeply affected by their war experiences.

My grandfather died fairly young from war-related health problems, but my grandmother I remember being angry and unforgiving about her experiences, right until she died.





Some were brought home to be buried in their communities, some were buried near where they died, but some bodies were either not found or could not be identified. There are major memorials in all the theatres of war, such as the Menin Gate (Ypres, West Flanders, Belgium), as well as in towns and cities up and down the country.

There were also men who survived the war, some of whom suffered from what we now call post-traumatic stress disorder, but was then called shell shock. Many men suffered from trench fever and in 1918/19 many succumbed to the epidemic of Spanish Flu. Most men who got through the war never spoke of their experiences.

During the Great War the Home Guard were known as the Volunteer Force, or by the nickname of 'Gorgeous Wrecks' because of their 'Georgius Rex' armbands. Conscientious Objectors appealed their conscription, but were made to work on farms and in other places.

The Burpham War Memorial, at St Luke's Church, was erected in August 1920.

A service in the churchyard remembered the 17 men of Burpham and Jacob's Well, who had given their lives in the war. Two years later the 18th name was added. Another 11 names were added after the Second World War.

Harry Durrant was the first Burpham man to lose his life. He died in November 1914 at Ypres. Henry Williams and Percy Gunner died in 1915 in France. George Stillwell and Frederick Adams died in 1916, both at the Somme.

In March 1917 Tom Durrant died in Iraq, John Gunner died at the Somme and Norman Phillips (the only RFC pilot) died in aerial combat in France. James Knight died at Ypres in June, Charles Grey in September and Samson Gunner in November, both on the Western Front. In 1918 Thomas Searle and William Collis both died in March on the Somme, while the same month Jack Russell died

on the Western Front. Robert Knight died in a PoW camp in June; Walter Worsfold and Walter Wisdom died right at the end of the war, in November, in France. Finally, Edward Gunner died of influenza in 1919 in France.

Three sets of brothers, one father and son, and ten other men, all mourned by the community.

We will remember them.

Guildford Community Lottery

You may have already heard about the Guildford Community Lottery which has been launched to support local good causes. The BCA will be signing up to raise funds to help us become financially secure and also to give us the opportunity to help Burpham's local charities and good causes.

It is a weekly lottery with a draw every Saturday. Tickets cost £1 (for a month, quarter or year), and prizes range from £25 up to £25,000. If BCA joins in, each £1 ticket sold through the BCA will provide 50p to BCA, 10p to the Guildford Philanthropy Community Fund, 20p prize money and 20p admin costs to Gatherwell, the company that organises these lotteries.

Selling just 20 tickets per week brings in £500 a year for the BCA. In the face of significant challenges from congestion to house building, it helps fund professional advice or pollution surveys.

There is a café, shops, entertainment and special carers who do not disrupt the day-to-day routines of the residents unless they have to.

The experiment that goes back to 2015 has shown that, if someone living with dementia is allowed to carry out daily tasks, at their own time, and with those trained to understand their needs, they can live a much more active and useful life than being isolated inside a family or, as is the case now, ending up in a nursing home where everything is done for them while they deteriorate into a twilight zone.

"What we saw was the world leader in this type of care, where people in varying stages of the illness can continue to live full lives."

What is encouraging is that I've discovered that such a village is being planned in the UK – in Canterbury. Plans are being drawn up for the ambitious development, which would sit on 15 acres of land to the south of the city and cater for 250 sufferers of the degenerative disease. The Canterbury project is based on the concept of care in The Netherlands, and will form part of a company's 4,000-home scheme.

Simon Wright, the developer's chief executive, is in talks with bosses at care home provider Avante, who joined him on a trip to see the groundbreaking Dutch facility.

"It was a real eye-opener," he said. "What we saw was the world leader in this type of care, where people in varying stages of the illness can continue to live full lives.

"You would have thought you were in a Costa Coffee because it was so relaxed.

"People were walking about and when I asked "where are the residents with dementia?' I was told they were all around us."

The Canterbury project would include apartments, houses and a care centre for those in the more advanced stages of the disease. It would also have its own cinema, convenience store and cafe, as well as recreational areas like a village square and gardens. Residents would buy or rent their accommodation and pay for their level of care.

So what's not to like? Wouldn't it be wonderful if there was a 'village' like Hogeweyk in every town in the UK?

Scarred for life?

Not necessarily, if you take the right steps at the right time.

Scars, also called adhesions when situated deep in our body, are an inevitable fact of life. They are the results of the body's healing process. The tissue involved in the process of scarring is called the connective tissue. 'Connective' because it connects, supports, binds and separates other tissues or organs.

When we injure ourselves, the repair process has to happen quickly. Because of the emergency of the response, the tissue produced is not of the same quality as the original one. Instead of a good, strong 'patch' of well-aligned fibres, we end up with a lower quality tissue. The poor quality of this new tissue results in poorer functionality. For example, somebody with a poorly healed ankle sprain or a pulled muscle will be more likely to have a recurrence of the same injury.

As living creatures we are very exposed to traumatic events such as sprains and strains, pulled muscles and torn tendons. These injuries will heal with the inevitable scar tissue. In addition, the healing process resulting from any inflammation and infection will also result in the formation of some scar tissue.

Surgery, particularly abdominal and pelvic surgery, is also a cause of internal scarring. The problem is that these 'adhesions' can squeeze organs, diminish the blood flow, trap nerves and reduce or impede the mobility of organs. The end result usually involves discomfort, pain and reduced mobility.

If we imagine our body as a structure delicately balanced between 'elasticity' (skin, muscles, connective tissue) and 'rigidity' (bones), we have a very smart design allowing stress to be distributed equally throughout. The end result is flexibility and stability. As soon as there is scarring or adhesions anywhere in the body, this delicate balance is compromised. This in turn results in us 'cheating' and compensating e.g. if we cannot turn our head, we will turn our body.

When scar tissue forms it often traps other important structures such as small nerve endings and blood vessels. Trapped pain receptors can cause a scar to remain painful long after the injury has healed. This is often the case with coccyx pain (after a fall on the buttocks). During the healing process other receptors may be disturbed by scar tissue and this may prevent the brain from receiving the correct feedback allowing it to control properly how we stand and move.

There are ways to mitigate the damage and to redress the balance. The thing to remember is that although it is important to give an injury time to heal, it is just as important to start the rehabilitation process as early as possible. We are

designed to move and lengthening the period of immobility is not helpful. This is why in the case of a mild whiplash injury, for example, neck collars are only advisable in a very limited number of cases and for as short a period as possible.

Physical therapists can help by monitoring the healing process of an internal wound, skin, muscle, tendon, or a ligament and will progressively introduce soft tissue work (superficial or deep massage) and gentle passive, active and resisted exercises. This will improve the quality of scar tissue and restore functionality by increasing mobility, flexibility and strength.

Scarred for life? Not necessarily, if you take the right steps at the right time.



Well done to Mr. & Mrs A. George, 10 Marlyns Close who have won the Deane Cup for the Best Kept Summer Front Garden. The Trading Hut is now closed until March. At our meeting on November 27th Andrew Halstead will be talking about 'Bumble Bees and Wasps', at the end of the meeting the club's trophies will be presented. There is no Meeting in December.

Things to do in the garden in November

- The planting of Tulips should be completed this month.
- Cut down faded Perennials leaving Penstemons and other late perennials to flower on.
- If you do not want to risk frost damage to your Dahlias and Cannas by over wintering the in the ground, they should be lifted and stored in a dry frost free place.
- An application of mulch should be given to Agapanthus to protect them from extreme cold.
- As the days draw in reduce the watering of houseplants.
- Amaryllis bulbs should be potted up for Christmas flowering.

- Bring potted Hyacinths into a light cool into a light cool area once they begin to shoot.
- Nalf hardy Fuchsias & Pelargonium's should be brought under cover. Cut back Pelargonium's and reduce watering so that they become dormant during Winter months.
- Now is a good time to plant Raspberry Canes, Fruit trees and Bushes.
- Start the Winter pruning of Apples and Pears.
- Naquadulce Broad Beans should be planted this month to produce an early crop ahead of the Black Fly invasion next Spring. Garlic Cloves can still be planted.
- Regularly rake leaves off of the lawn.

Things to do in the garden in December.

- Regularly water indoor Azaleas with rainwater to prevent the dense root ball drying out.
- The most popular plant at this time of the year is the Poinsettia, to keep it at its best it needs to be in a warm light place away from draughts, do not overwater.
- Neep all houseplants in a bright

- place as winter light levels fall, do not leave them overnight in the cold between the closed curtains and the window.
- Clear the Vegetable plot of left over plant debris from Summer produce and then dig the ground to open up soil so that any bugs and diseases are killed by the winter frost.
- Force Rhubarb by covering the crowns with a dark coloured bucket
- Pinch out the tips of sweet peas sown in October to encourage bushy growth.

Keep all houseplants in a bright place as winter light levels fall, do not leave them overnight in the cold between the closed curtains and the window.

- Name of the Prune Grape Vines before Christmas to avoid bleeding.
- In mild weather the lawn should be mown on a high cut.
- Neep off of the grass when it is frostv or verv wet.
- Insulate garden taps and exposed pipework from extreme weather.
