



I am not much of a gardener... but I do love flowers, so every year I visit a garden

centre, get a few trays of annuals and get my hands dirty planting them out in pots.

Usually, I can remember to water them enough, and the tiny amount of time, energy

Perhaps you might like to join me in this personal gardening adventure who knows what good things God might be wanting to grow in my life and yours!

Annual General Meeting

The AGM took place via Zoom on May 13th. We were ioined by Angela Richardson MP who engaged in a lively and good-humoured discussion with members; the BCA would like to thank her for taking the time to talk to us.

Topics covered included:

- Gosden Hill Farm developments and the importance of adequate infrastructure.
- The possibility of an A3 tunnel and its likely impact on carbon emissions.
- Weyside Urban Village and concerns over sewage capacity and the provision of fresh water. We have subsequently learnt that GBC has been reviewing the needs for new developments and has been told by Thames Water that there is very limited additional drinking water available. The BCA will provide more details when we have had time to study the report carefully and consider the implications.
- Limited medical facilities available now Burpham has no GP surgery.
- Proposed country wide changes in planning legislation which could leave local authorities with little control.
- The importance of listening to local voices.

articles that we're planning to raise funds for two Community Public Access Defibrillators (cPAD) in Burpham. The locations are yet to be fully confirmed but we're intending one to be fitted outside Sutherland Memorial Hall and one near the shopping parade. We'll be working alongside The Community HeartBeat Trust which is a charity whose aims are to help and support communities in the correct provision of defibrillators. So far they have helped over 4500 communities so we're in safe hands!

Defibrillators (also known as AEDs) are medical devices that help and support a rescue for a patient in cardiac arrest. They achieve this by applying a current of electricity across the heart to stop it, allowing it to reconfigure automatically. Defibrillators are not 'Heart Re-starters' - any sign indicating this is wrong!



Death from cardiac arrest if untreated is about 97% of cases. With the correct and rapid treatment, survival to hospital can, in theory, be raised to around the 70% mark, but this assumes rapid action, good CPR (chest compressions) and also the timely use of a defibrillator.

Of course, there's no point buying and fitting a couple of cPADs and iust leaving them. We'll need to sort out awareness sessions for the community as well as ongoing maintenance to ensure that the units



Jonathan was born in Leighton
Buzzard in 1846. In his youth he was
an agricultural labourer on farms
in Bedfordshire, then worked as
a coachman. In 1869 he married
Martha Tarrier in Luton and they had
eight children, though five died in
infancy, the last three being born in
Worplesdon. It's not clear why they
moved to Surrey, or how John (as he
became known) came to Burpham,
but by 1876 he was working in
Worplesdon as a coachman.

It's likely that they didn't live in Burpham as they had three of their children baptized at St Mary's, Worplesdon in 1876, but the rest were baptized at St Luke's. By 1878 he was recorded as being the Publican for the Green Man and was living there with his family and lodgers. The pub was owned by the Elkins family until 1890, when it was sold to Hodgsons Kinaston Breweries.

Martha died in 1884, aged 37 years, leaving John working at the pub and looking after four small children. She was buried in St Luke's graveyard.

In the late 19th century, Burpham was still a small hamlet, with around 350 residents, one church and two pubs. John would have been an important man in the community, knowing most people as the Green Man would have been a popular meeting place. In 1888, having lived here for about ten years, John married Maud Ellen Durrant Mansell of Chiddingfold. They had four children, of which their only son, Frederick, served in the Great War.

John continued as publican at the Green Man into the early 20th century, but from 1909 to 1912 he was replaced by Alfred Jacob. For some reason he became a builder's contractor and was living with his wife and four children in George Road in Guildford. (Why the change?) However, by 1913 John was back running the pub, which he

continued to do until about 1922.

From about 1920 they lived at Cornflower Cottages in Burpham, no longer residing at the pub. John died in 1927 and Maud Ellen moved to Woking until her death in 1936. She was buried with John at St Luke's.



Many of John's children stayed in the Burpham and Woking area and it may be that some of their families are still living here – *I would love to find out*. John Junior, and wife Emily, lived on Burpham Lane for many years and his two daughters attended the local school.

But the questions remain – why did Jonathan Dudley come to Surrey and why, in his sixties, did he change jobs but then return to the pub for another ten years? If you know then please do tell me!



On the 23rd of June, Alan Turing's birthday, the new polymer £50 note entered circulation. The design on the note honours Turing's revolutionary work at **Bletchley Park** in the second world war in decrypting Nazi Germany's **Enigma machine** and pioneering the field of study that would eventually develop computers. So, how and why has his life been celebrated in the newest banknote?

Born in 1912 in London, English mathematician Alan Turing grew up in **Guildford** and later attended King's College, Cambridge and earned a degree in mathematics. He also attended Princeton University, USA, where he obtained his PhD. Aside from his remarkable talents in mathematics, science and cryptography, he was an Olympic level runner, completing a number of marathons and running great distances every day. He grew up very self-reliant and didn't fit in with fellow students, although he was greatly

affected by the death of his close friend Christopher Morcom, with whom he worked together on scientific ideas. This was his first close friendship, and the sudden loss was devastating.

The design on the new £50 note honours Turing's revolutionary work at Bletchley Park in the second world war in decrypting Nazi Germany's Enigma machine and pioneering the field of study that would eventually develop computers.

Alan wanted to believe that Christopher's spirit lived on, which inspired the foundation of Turing's later work involving a strong interest in the mind. This later manifested in his concept of the universal machine, which could solve any mathematical problem, much like the human brain. This idea eventually evolved into

modern day computers.

Bletchlev Park was shrouded in the highest levels of secrecy during World War II and beyond, as it housed those whose job it was to intercept enemy radio signals, decode them and deliver the intelligence to the military and government. They recruited those with the strongest problem-solving skills by attracting candidates using cryptic crossword puzzles. On the 4th of September 1939, Turing and a handful of other mathematicians, linguists and chess champions were recruited into Bletchley park and he soon became the head of the Naval Enigma Team, working in Hut 8. Their job was to decipher the daily communications intercepted from Nazi Germany and their allies encrypted through the use of the Enigma machine. This device allowed complex message encoding which changed on a daily basis. Although the ever-changing code was initially thought impossible to crack, Turing

led the team responsible for analysing the enciphered messages, which held critical information of secret Nazi military operations.

While others in his team attempted to break the code using traditional means, Turing soon realised that only a machine would be able to compute the vast number of possible combinations in the time required. He and his colleague Gordon Welchman designed and built the **Bombe**, an electro-mechanical device used to successfully break the enigma codes. Vast amounts of priceless information about enemy operations were gained through the use of this machine, which shortened the war by an estimated two years, saving countless lives.

The reverse of the new £50 note, released on the 23rd of June 2021 features a design composed of a picture of Alan Turing – based on the photo owned by the National Portrait Gallery – as well as images of a matrix table, binary code, Bombe technical drawings and a mathematical formula. It also features Turing's signature, taken from the signature book on display at Bletchley Park Trust. The

note itself retains its deep red colour and, as ever, the queen's face.

The quote on the new £50 note was taken from an interview, where Turing said, "This is only a foretaste of what is to come, and only the shadow of what is going to be."

His life in Guildford is attested to by the blue plaque at 22 Ennismore Avenue (although it was number eight when he lived there), where his parents moved from London to raise him and his brother in 1927. His family would regularly visit the nearby Stoke Park, which they lived next to, by going on long walks there, and at the North Downs. Alan would also go on to use Stoke Park as a frequent running spot. Astronomy interested him when he lived here, and he found that the Guildford skies were excellent for stargazing. John Turing, Alan's brother, even married at St John's Stoke Church. After his parents separated, his father relocated to London, whilst his mother stayed in Guildford, moving to Epsom

Road and then South Hill, where Alan would visit, going on long walks with her, where they discussed his work. A statue of Turing was raised on the Surrey University campus to memorialise him in 2004.

Needless to say, without Turing, we wouldn't have modern computers. He founded an entire field of study and saved the lives of many thousands in the war. Turing died in 1954 by suicide, after being sentenced to hormone therapy - by the same government he helped to win a war - to 'cure' his homosexuality. He was cremated at Woking Crematorium, and his ashes were spread where his father's had been. In 2013, the gueen signed a royal pardon for Turing's conviction. The quote on the new £50 note was taken from an interview, where he said, "This is only a foretaste of what is to come, and only the shadow of what is going to be."

Alan Turing was shaped, in part, by his life in Guildford, and went on to achieve great things, which have impacted all of us. I believe this is something that we can all feel connected to and proud of.

Things to do in the garden in July.

- Remove the main stem of Cordon Tomatoes just above the fourth truss, any fruit that forms above this truss is unlikely to ripen before winter sets in.
- Spray Potatoes and Tomatoes when it is wet and muggy to reduce the risk of blight damage.
- A regular feed of Tomorite will help Tomatoes and Dahlias to produce good fruit and flowers, start feeding Tomatoes as soon as the first fruit starts to form, irregular watering will encourage blossom end rot in Tomatoes.
- Continue to make successional sowings of Salad Crops
- Regularly pick Courgettes unless you wish the fruit to become Marrows.
- French and Runner Beans will become tough and stringy unless they are picked frequently.
- Spring Cabbage, Turnip and a final batch of french and Runner Beans should now be sown. Leeks and Winter Brassicas should be planted out this month.

- Give Summer Bedding Plants and containerised plants a regular Liquid feed.
- Dead head Bedding Plants to maintain a colourful display and Perennials to obtain a second flush of bloom.
- Keep containerised Camellias and Rhododendrons well watered to enable good flowering next year.

Things to do in the garden in August.

Now that all the hard work has been done it is time to sit back and to enjoy your garden. which should now be at the peak of perfection.

Set the mower blades on high when cutting the grass during dry periods.

- Continue to harvest fast growing Vegetables and Salad crops as they mature.
- Keep Runner Beans well watered which will help the flowers to set.
- Increase the feeding of Tomatoes.
- Lift Maincrop Potatoes.
- Rambling Roses which only flower once a year should be pruned after

- flowering, cutting out one in three stems from the base to encourage new growth.
- Summer prune Wisteria, removing all new shoots to five buds above the main stem.
- Now is the time to take cuttings of Buddleia, Hydrangea and Pyracantha.
- Cut back Perennials which have collapsed onto the lawn, path or other plants.
- Now is the time to set Earwig traps amongst your Dahlias, fill a 3" pot with hay or straw and place it upside down on the end of the cane supporting the plant, the Earwigs will climb into the pot during the night and will be waiting for you to shake them out into a dish in the morning for disposal.
- This month you can start collecting seed from Annuals ready for sowing next Spring, do not collect the seed of F1 hybrids as they will not produce flowers true to type next year.
- Set the mower blades on high when cutting the grass during dry periods.
