London Road 'Active Travel Scheme' roadworks under 'consultation'.



The scheme was due to get underway on 9th January, but will now be postponed to allow more detailed discussion with the local community – 'to help ensure the benefits of the scheme are widely understood and delivered', according to Surrey County Council.

The project has been planned to take around five months, with the timeline squeezed to reduce disruption as much as possible. A new set of engagement events will be announced in the new year, with the start date to be confirmed.

Fiona Davidson, Surrey county councillor for Guildford South East (R4GV) is pleased to report that "Cllr Tim Oliver, Leader of Surrey County Council, has listened to and responded to the very significant and reasonable concerns about the current proposals for the London Road active travel scheme raised by residents, councillors, businesses and schools. The way the scheme has been managed so far has galvanised a level

of anger and discontent that is unusual for Guildford.

We all now need to work together – residents, councillors, schools, businesses and Surrey County Council – to find a way forward that is acceptable to all parties. I look forward to being part of the revamped consultation exercise."

Cllr Davidson has arranged for this meeting to take place on Thursday 5th January, 6.30-8.30pm at Raynham Hall, George Abbot School (prior to the publication of this magazine).

The original project had been planned to take around five months, with the timeline compressed in an attempt

What is Active Travel?

Following unprecedented levels of walking and cycling across the UK during the pandemic, the government announced a funding package to encourage more people to choose alternatives to public transport when they need to travel, making healthier habits easier and helping make sure the road, bus and rail networks are ready to respond to future increases in demand.

Why are Surrey County Council doing this?

SCC want to ensure our roads are safer and more accessible for children, pedestrians and cyclists travelling around Guildford.

What are SCC going to do?

- Installing one-way segregated cycle paths on both sides of London Road
- Upgrading the existing roundabouts to provide safer crossings for cyclists and pedestrians
- New crossing points
- Improvements to existing junctions
- Upgrading bus stops

Was there a consultation?

A consultation was carried out with residents and businesses in *Continued over.*

2021. SCC invited residents to take part based on their age group and demographic to ensure they had a true representation of the views of the community.

The consultation showed that 58% of those residents and businesses engaged with supported the scheme, with 27% feeling that they didn't support the scheme and 15% unsure of their view. We haven't made this public to date as we wanted to ensure that we were going ahead with the scheme, but we will be sharing the results of the consultation on the website and at the community event.

What impact will these works have on the local community?

SCC understand the significant impact that these works will have on the local community and have examined several options of how to carry out these works safely for both the workforce and residents. These options included traffic lights that would have taken twice the time as well as causing significant traffic congestion in both directions.

Having examined all possible options and given the legal constraints of health and safety, the one-way closure was the shortest duration for the works.

Saving Sutherland Memorial Hall



It's been months now that the community hall in the park has been closed to residents for meetings and events. Although the nursery and playgroup continue to operate, the closure is a loss for small groups, classes and community events.

Hope is at hand. A number of community groups and local clubs have gathered together to bid for the right to run the hall. It is supported by representatives of all the local political parties, the church, sports clubs, the **Burpham Community Association** and **Neighbourhood Forum**, and it is chaired by **Burpham Wellbeing**.

The group would manage the hall in the evenings and weekends so that there is a place for local activities, and it would prioritise community events. Its vision is to make Sutherland Hall a hub for local people with a special emphasis on health, wellbeing, community and Burpham residents. Hire rates will be affordable and most importantly, run by you and for you.

The council invited groups to express interest in managing the hall, but later withdrew the offer 'to do a bit more work on the qualitative assessment of

expressions of interest'. We are once again waiting on the council.

...the vision is to make Sutherland Hall a hub for local people with a special emphasis on health, wellbeing, community and Burpham residents.

Once we are up and running, we will cover all our costs and in the meantime we are applying for grants to help us 'start up'. But what we need most is people with expertise in, say, writing a business plan, forming a health and safety policy, formalising the group as a properly-constituted entity, establishing a booking system and so on. We'd love to hear from residents if they have this expertise and can support our efforts this winter.





Guildford in Bloom announces Teacher Twilight Session



Guildford Schools in Bloom Team have announced an informative twilight session for teachers and TA's to help local schools get ready for the 2023 competition.

The event, on 6 February 2023 takes place at Edwins Garden Centre at Clandon Park – a long term supporter of the Guildford Schools in Bloom programme. with metals, creating objects such as agricultural tools, gates, furniture, decorative and religious items, etc, as well as shoeing horses' hooves. Although it is very likely that there was one in the area many years before, the earliest record found for a blacksmith in Burpham was for George Heath, who was apprenticed to learn his trade in 1743. By the time he died in 1793 he was both Burpham blacksmith and Innkeeper at the Anchor and Horseshoes pub. The Heath family continued with the smithing business for several generations, two Georges, two James and Samuel, who was the last until he emigrated to Canada in 1855. The business was taken over by Charles Puttock, whose son and grandson, along with a nephew Henry Edmead, continued in the forge on London Road until about 1911. Charles died in 1937 after being struck

by a plane that crashed in Stoke Park.

According to the Tithe Maps of 1838, the blacksmith lived in Rose Cottage, on London Road, with his forge next door – later to become Guildford Signs. There seems to be some evidence that there had been a forge next to the Anchor and Horseshoes pub in previous years, but no written records survive to prove this. In 1905 Lord Onslow sold the property consisting of seven rooms, a garden and pigsty, as well as the farrier's shop, stabling for two horses, a chaise house and woodland attached.

Since 1911 there has been no blacksmith in Burpham, as the world changed and motor cars replaced horse drawn carriages. However, in recent years there have been several examples of modern blacksmiths creating signs and artistic structures instead. There is the sign above the entrance to Sutherland Memorial Park, but it's not known when this appeared.

In 1991 the new village sign was erected, following a competition for ideas – won by Don Scott's photo of St Luke's Church. Although the first shops on London Road opened in the 1930s, it was only in 2012 that the signs, designed by Nick Bates of Burrows Lea Forge in Shere, were placed in front of the London Road and Kingpost Parade shops.

In 2015, when Aldi opened their shop, the sculpture of the Green Man was placed on the wall, to remember the history of the site – this was also created by Nick Bates.

In 2017 the Nine Standing Leaf sculpture, also known as the Sutherland Circle, was created in Sutherland Memorial Park, designed by Steve Tomlinson, with ideas from children at Burpham Primary School.

Traffic Chaos in Burpham

Unless common sense prevails, Burpham looks set to become the centre of unimaginable traffic chaos in the new year.

SCC are proposing to carry out roadworks along the A3100 that will involve:

- Installing one-way segregated cycle paths on both sides of London Road
- Upgrading the existing roundabouts to provide safer crossings for cyclists and pedestrians
- New crossing points
- Improvements to existing junctions
- Upgrading bus stops.

The work involves the stretch of road from the Boxgrove roundabout to the New Inn Lane roundabout. The northbound stretch (travelling towards Burpham) will be closed to all traffic; access will be via the southbound road only. Working times will be Monday to Friday 0700h to 1900h, Saturday 0800h to 1600h. In addition there will be some night working on unspecified dates leading to closures of London Road, Woodruff Avenue, Weylea Avenue, Burpham Lane and New Inn Lane.

This means that all north bound

traffic heading to Burpham, the north bound A3 slip road and Clay Lane will have a three mile detour via Boxgrove Road and the Epsom Road to Merrow, then down Park Lane and New Inn Lane.

Has anyone at County Hall thought this one through? If this work goes ahead Burpham is facing months of chaos that will affect not just our residents but all the many other people who use the A3100. At worst, Boxgrove, Merrow and Burpham could end up completely gridlocked thus contributing even more to the already high levels of pollution. Has any thought been given to the effect on the local economy? Burpham has two supermarkets, a parade of local shops and restaurants, and a pub. They will all suffer loss of revenue. The north bound A3100 gives access to George Abbot school; that should lead to an interesting school run via Merrow, already choked with the St. Peter's traffic. plus three primary schools. And what about emergency vehicles, an all too common sight along

reduction of vehicular lane width to 3 metres, the appalling lack of proper consultation – surely a prerequisite before such an undertaking – and the short notice given. We asked for a postponement to allow for proper consultation and a less disruptive solution.

It is clear from social media comment that many others share our concerns. This may have prompted an announcement on 2nd December that the work, originally planned for two stages from January to August, will now finish at the end of May. A drop-in session was arranged on 17th December "for residents to find out more, see the plans and raise any questions." Will anyone be listening?



I confess I hadn't even realised that was a film title from 1966 until I googled it to see when the phrase first appeared! Clearly that feeling that everything is out of control has been around somewhat longer than I'd imagined, but surely becoming harder and harder to ignore.

As we head on into that clean sheet of 2023, I wonder if happiness seems simply unrealistic and out of reach. I recently came across this quote from JC Ryle (a 19th Century Anglican Bishop)

"To be truly happy, a person must be able to look in every direction without uncomfortable feelings. They must be able to look back to the past without guilty fears; they must be able to

look around themselves without discontent; they must be able to look forward without anxious dread."

What a challenging, and yet thoughtprovoking statement. How are things in every direction for you? Some of us look back at the past with deep shame and resolutely turn to the future so that we don't have to face the reality of what has happened to us and through us. Others of us are so scared of what the future might hold, that we keep our eyes firmly fixed on the past when everything felt safer. Still others of us try to live in the moment without care for others, for the past and ignoring what lies ahead. But none of these approaches are ultimately very satisfying. I wonder if JC Ryle was onto something all those years ago?

For him and for Christians around the world, the secret of such happiness is not a thing nor a mindset, but a who. A few weeks ago at Christmas we celebrated again the coming of Jesus, 2000 years ago. An irrelevant middle eastern religious leader, or perhaps, "Immanuel – God with us" as the Bible declares it.

This is why JC Ryle, and millions of Christians both before and after him, have been able to do a genuine 360 look at life without distress. Once you have truly discovered that God is with you, it enables you to tackle life differently however much difficulty lies ahead and whatever has passed already. Maybe something worth exploring in 2023?

Things to do in the garden in January.

If you cannot garden because the soil is rain sodden or frosted vou can use your time by studying plant catalogues which have arrived in the post on a regular basis.

...remember that this vear's novelty seeds are likely to be next year's ordinary seeds.

The same advice applies as when ordering spring flowering bulbs, the larger the plants you buy the better they will be when planted out in May. If you only need a few plants it would probably be better to visit a local nursery such as Elm Nursery at Sutton Green in May where you can select your plants first hand.

New seed varieties which are usually F1 Hybrids are expensive to buy and often difficult to germinate, so look on the back of the packet to see how many seeds you are buying for your money, remember that this year's novelty seeds are likely to be next year's ordinary seeds.

Whilst the fruit buds are still dormant Apple and Pear trees can be pruned. cut out any congested growth to increase airflow which will improve the quality of next seasons fruit, cut back to a fruit bud which is large and rounded on older growth, one year old shoots should be pruned back to a slender bud.

Things to do in the garden in February.

- Plunge shrivelled Dahlia tubers into a bucket of tepid water overnight, having removed any rotten tubers, they can then be started into growth to provide cuttings for new plants, place the tubers in a seed tray or pot and lightly cover with damp soil.
- Slow germinating annuals such as Antirrhinum and Lobelia should be sown indoors.
- New Prune Summer flowering deciduous shrubs such as Buddleia which flower on the current year's growth.
- Cut back Summer and Autumn flowering Clematis to the lowest pair of strong buds.

- Sow Sweet Peas and pot on those sown in the Autumn.
- When it is mild Broad Beans. Carrots and Parsnips can be sown under cloches.

- Sow Greenhouse Tomatoes. Cucumbers and Peppers at 21°C.
- Seed Potatoes should be placed on their ends in a light, cool, frost free place to sprout.
