

# The Burpham Community Charter: Your chance to shape Burpham's Community Hub



Regular Burpham Pages readers will be aware that a number of locals have been working together to secure local management of Burpham's community assets in Sutherland Memorial Park.

The battle began back in April 2021, and despite the concerted efforts of all involved, it has yet to succeed.

The good news is our campaign is gathering momentum, we have amassed over 20 residents to form **Burpham Community Hub**. We also have the support of our local councillor and MP. And, we continue to welcome new supporters – so if you want to join our community collective let us know **burphamwellbeing@gmail.com**.

The not so good news is that in January our expression of interest for **Sutherland Memorial Hall** was rejected by **Guildford Borough Council**. In order to deliver the requirements set by the council certain

costs need to be covered. GBC stated in its terms it is unwilling to cover those costs. We are now at a deadlock because without a formal arrangement with GBC we cannot apply for grants or funding to cover those costs.

Everyone in the Burpham Community Hub is of the opinion that the Hall, Cricket Pavilion and Tennis Courts/5-a-side pitches should be run by the community for the community. We believe this is a fair assumption, and are now seeking to back it up with a survey.

This is where we need you – just 3 minutes of your time to share your opinions and ideas about what services you'd like to see in Burpham

to improve our community. The results of the survey will be used to create a community charter that we'd like to present to GBC and the various funding bodies we'll be approaching to enable us to deliver the facilities, events, classes, courses and services you'd like to see.

# New Service set to speed up MRI scans for heart patients with pacemakers.

People with implanted pacemakers and defibrillators will now be able to access a new high quality MRI scanning service launched today by VCL, the specialist imaging company based at The Surrey Research Park.

At present, patients with pacemakers and defibrillators are either prevented from undergoing essential MRI imaging or have unacceptably long waits. This causes significant problems to patients – and their clinicians – particularly in cardiology, cancer care, neurology and orthopaedics.

The 'magnetic challenges' that arise for these patients during scanning can only be addressed by exceptionally highly skilled radiographers and technicians, that VCL is now able to provide.

VCL was founded by two local cardiologists Dr Edward Leatham and Dr Michael Hickman in 2020 with the sole objective of improving access to the latest technological advances specialist imaging.

These highly specialised new MRI scans, which use the latest Siemens 1.5T MRI Scanner, require the joint

expertise of a multidisciplinary team to undertake these vital scans safely and as quickly as possible after the need has been identified.

Dr Leatham explained: "Patients with pacemakers can only have an MRI scan if there's a highly experienced multidisciplinary team available both to programme their pacemaker (before and after) and operate the scanner to ensure the patient's safety. For instance, if a person has a raised PSA test there is often a need for an MRI to establish whether they have prostate cancer, however it is increasingly impossible to deliver this within the required timeframe. Therefore, some patients with pacemakers either must undergo a biopsy instead of an MRI scan or wait until a specialist team is available - if at all. Waiting lists for MRIs are already long, but particularly so for pacemaker patients; our new service potentially

puts an end to all this."

This is not the first breakthrough from VCL; through its partnerships with global leaders in medical imaging technology, it has developed a number of UK-first patient pathways for one-stop chest pain assessment including CT coronary angiography that uses Artificial Intelligence (AI) to assist with detection of critical coronary artery disease up to ten years before symptoms occur (www. heartscandirect.com). It has enabled many patients with Critical Coronary disease to avoid often lengthy – and risky – waits for diagnosis and treatment.

Dr Hickman said: "Following the Covid pandemic, the backlog in NHS services nationally has been particularly harmful to cardiovascular health, due to diminished access and delayed diagnoses. At VCL, we provide direct access to a streamlined, high-quality, patient-centred service that overcomes these delays in accessing healthcare."

Dr Leatham added: "While we have contracts with all major private medical insurance companies, we are hoping that the NHS will consider out-sourcing some of its MRI/CT demand; our CT scanner for instance may very well sit idle for three days a week and has the capacity to help tackle patients who are waiting, so we believe we hold the answer to speeding up diagnosis and treatment in this area; we are in active negotiations with government and NHS officials to help tackle NHS waiting lists."

The launch was attended by Guildford MP, Angela Richardson, who commented "This new scanner is a welcome addition to imaging services in this area and I will do all I can to encourage outsourcing to specialist scan providers that have both the expertise and capacity to reduce waiting lists locally."



# Guildford in Bloom Launches Annual Gardening Competition for Residents and Schools.

The Guildford in Bloom Gardening Competition, which is open to residents and businesses in Guildford Borough launched on 14 February 2023 alongside the Schools in Bloom competition which launched at the end of January 2023.

The theme for this year is For King and Countryside which incorporates both the Coronation celebrations and King Charles III's love of wildlife

Part of the **Guildford in Bloom** ethos is to create diverse habitats that encourage and protect wildlife, especially our pollinators. #### Challengers charity builds new accessible playground for disabled children.

Work has started on a new, stateof-the-art inclusive playground at the Guildford playcentre of charity **Challengers**. The specially designed playground in **Stoke Park** will have a huge impact on the lives of thousands of disabled children who are often unable to use typical playgrounds in their own communities.

Challengers has provided more than 40 years of fun and accessible play for children of all ages and continues to champion play for disabled children.

The charity raised £300,000 to build the playground through a fundraising campaign called the **Big Play Appeal**. The playground's design, inspired by the Surrey Hills, will be a multi-functional space with specialist equipment aimed at facilitating fun and adventure for disabled children.

Inclusive and accessible, the equipment is exciting and varied, providing the opportunity for climbing, sliding, swinging and creative play.

Most importantly, the playground will mean disabled children will be able to play with their non-disabled peers in a safe, accessible space where they can have fun and make friends.

Challengers is especially excited and proud that the new playground will see the first installation in the UK of a We-Go-Swing, which represents a revolutionary step forward in inclusive play. The swing, allows wheelchair and

non-wheelchair users to play together. Unlike many accessible swings that are segregated from main play areas, this swing is designed to be fully integrated into the playground setting.

According to research from the disability equality charity **Scope** "half of families with disabled children in the UK face accessibility problems with their local playground".

The 2022 Challengers parent survey indicated only 6% of Surrey families felt there was enough access to safe and accessible play in Guildford. Challengers wants to change that.

British Paralympian and Challengers Patron **Rachel Morris MBE** said: "I'm delighted to see that Challengers are building a new, accessible playground with top-of-the-range equipment for disabled children to enjoy in Surrey.

"This will make such a difference to disabled children's lives and will help to break down the barriers to play they are faced with daily."

Parents whose children attend Challengers are also really excited about the new playground and the difference it will make to their children's lives.


One Challengers parent supporter said: "Children with disabilities deserve opportunities to access play. This is currently something we lack in Surrey.

"This playground will allow children to play in a safe and secure area. Parents will feel comfortable and safe when allowing their children to play in this new playground, this is often something they can't feel in other playgrounds in Surrey."

The playground is due to open in early Spring 2023 and the charity will be show-casing it with a special launch event.

#### **Burpham Ward Candidates - May 4th Borough Elections**

#### **R4GV: Liz Hyland**



I'm Liz Hyland and I'm going to stand in Burpham Ward as one of the two candidates representing

Residents for Guildford and Villages (R4GV) in the local election on 4th May; my R4GV partner candidate is Charles Wilce.

We formed R4GV in early 2019. We're from all walks of life and political

viewpoints but all members of R4GV have two things in common:

- The passion to make the borough better for everyone who lives, works, and visits here
- The belief that a council free from the distractions and partisan agendas of party politics is best placed to serve its community

In the May 2019 election, R4GV became the second largest group on the council when 15 of the 17 candidates we put forward became councillors. Our leader Joss Bigmore became the council leader when the Lib Dems handed over the baton during the rather challenging Covid-years.

- Keep all development in Burpham strictly in line with the Neighbourhood Plan

#### **Labour: Ian Creese**



In the last few months, I have had the pleasure of meeting many of you who I did not already know. Since

I began my campaign to represent you as one of your two borough councillors, I have spoken to neighbours on their doorsteps, on Kingpost Parade and in Sutherland Park.

Two key issues have arisen, time and time again. Firstly, the temporary forthcoming road closure of London Road for improved cycle lanes. Secondly, Burpham's lack of a GP surgery since the New Inn Surgery closed in 2019. I wanted to take the opportunity to update you on my position on the former and ask for your support on the latter.

With regard to London Road, we all agree with the aims of reducing carbon emissions, improving air quality and facilitating safe exercise for adults and schoolchildren. However, the County Council's plan for this work was poorly shared, lacked consultation and left many questions unanswered. A last-minute consultation meeting at George Abbot school led to the formation of the 'London Road Action Group' which has members from all political parties and with no political affiliation. I believe that this is the best way to make sure that common sense prevails.

Turning to the issue of the lack of a GP surgery, I feel that the absence of one in Burpham is completely unsatisfactory. Like myself, after the surgery's closure, many of you will have re-registered at

the surgery in Merrow or one of the ones in the centre of town. My personal experience at the Merrow surgery has been first class, I thank them for welcoming me. My only problem is location.

With over five thousand residents, Burpham includes parents with small children, those with mobility issues and the elderly. A round trip to the doctors by bus seems unnecessarily arduous, particularly if the visitor is not well. I propose three things. Firstly, that the issue needs attention at Council level. Secondly, that the owners of groups of multiple surgeries in the area are approached. Thirdly, that any potential properties or sites are monitored.

I would welcome the support of those who agree, regardless of political party. If anyone has relevant experience in planning or the management of such facilities, I would be particularly interested.

### Conservative: Christian Holliday & Adam Heilbron



Burpham is a great place to live, work and play, with good schools, a thriving shopping parade and active

community groups that take pride in the village. But there is still room for improvement: Increasing pressure on roads, housing, local facilities, green spaces and local businesses means changes are required to how the Borough Council delivers for Burpham.

Your Conservative candidates in the May election are Adam Heilbron and Christian Holliday. Adam is 23 years old and was born, educated and raised in Burpham. He lives in Weylea Farm with his family. He has a degree in politics from the University of Surrey and regularly engages in local activities. Adam volunteered at a Covid vaccination centre during the pandemic. Adam

is keen to engage further across our community. Christian lives in Ockley Court with his wife and works as a planning consultant specialising in renewable energy. He was previously Councillor for Burpham between 2011 and 2019 and plays an active role in Burpham in relation to planning matters. Adam and Christian experience the same frustrations with traffic and access to local services as other readers of the Burpham Pages. They will continue to engage with Surrey County Council and residents over the London Road cycle lane proposals.

In these difficult financial times, it is necessary to refocus Council priorities on delivery of services to the service user, maximising every penny of public funds whilst keeping Council Tax low. If elected, and the Conservatives take back control of Guildford Borough Council, Adam and Christian are committed to restoring full availability of key public facilities, such as Sutherland Memorial Hall in Burpham, through the appointment of dedicate staff to run such facilities across the Borough. Adam and Christian will work to restore minimum acceptable standards of customer service provision, including answering phone calls and emails in a timely manner.

Adam and Christian will closely monitor Gosden Hill Farm and Weyside Urban Village, both of which have the potential to impact Burpham through additional pressures and, at the Weyside Urban Village, visual impacts on Burpham's nature reserve. Adam and Christian will work to strengthen planning policy and the Council's enforcement function, to ensure future development remains appropriate for Burpham.

Adam and Christian look forward to meeting as many of you as possible between now and polling day.

We've also declared a climate emergency, adopted an ambitious plan to make the council carbon neutral by 2030, and have re-written our planning policies to put sustainability and wildlife protection at their heart.

Some of my personal highlights from the past 4 years of work in Burpham:

- Stopping the introduction of parking charges at Sutherland Memorial Park
- Supporting the rebuilding of Burpham Bowling Club's clubhouse with a £10,000 grant
- Funding a safer speed limit review for Burpham Lane (due to take place in the 2023/24 financial year)
- The restoration of concrete road surfaces in Coltsfoot Drive, Charlock Way, Burnet Avenue and Woodruff Avenue, and pavement repairs on Gosden Hill Road
- The withdrawal of SCC's plans for a 5-month closure of London Road and a commitment to consult the

community properly on a re-designed London Road cycle scheme

None of these are things I can take sole credit for, but they are all things where I am pleased to have been able to help use my weight as a councillor to make a difference for our community.

I am actively supporting the Burpham Community Hub project in their efforts to get the Hall re-opened for public use, and I hope this can be resolved soon. Elsewhere, concrete blocks at Mallow Crescent still need to be covered with soil to create earth bunds, problem parking continues to obstruct traffic in Weylea Farm, privatised bus services are a mess, and there are ongoing problems with accessibility at the nature reserve.

These, and others, are issues I am currently working on as your local councillor, your local Liberal Democrat team will continue to work for you and our entire community if you place your trust in us again in this May's elections.

#### Flood Forum

#### The Burpham Flood Forum was held at the Village Hall on Friday 9th December 2022.

Chaired by Angela Richardson MP with agencies concerned with surface water and river management - GBC, SCC, Thames Water, the National Trust – well represented the meeting followed the details contained within the Action Plan prepared and updated by members of the Flood Action Group which you can access on our website. This allowed a detailed discussion concerning the state of the Gosden Hill and London Road Culverts, the watercourse of the Merrow Common River, bank erosion, flood defence issues and associated riparian responsibilities. Maintenance and upkeep also featured strongly with the high erosion on the Wey Navigation between Old Buck's Weir and Bowers Lock a particular concern, as well as problems associated with the Riverside Nature Reserve. The meeting concluded with a number of important aspects agreed for further investigation and action by specific groups of attendees. The importance and efforts of all concerned are much appreciated by the local community, a significant number of whom have experienced real problems in the past.

#### **London Road Active Travel Scheme**

The public meeting on January 5th was very well attended and lively, showing the depth of feeling about the proposed road closure to enable the cycle lanes to be improved.

The BCA is playing an active part in the London Road Action Group (LRAG) along with the Burpham Neighbourhood Forum, the Abbotswood, Ganghill and Boxgrove Avenue Residents Associations and local councillors.

At the time of writing in early February, Surrey County Council have corrected some of the errors in the information they had previously provided. They have agreed to reconsider many aspects of the scheme and its implementation. Work will not start until revised proposals have been fully consulted on, with LRAG and others and not before the start of the school summer holidays. This is intended to prevent interference with the May council elections as well as GSCE exams.

# Weylea Farm

Moira MacQuaide's history of Burpham

These days we all know Weylea Farm as a housing estate off the London Road in Burpham, but until the 1970s it was a working farm with quite a history, and names varying from Chagden to Shagden to Weylea.

The earliest reference found was in 1603, which was a rental agreement (written in Latin), but it seems that an area called Chagden Meadows was around in the time of Elizabeth I.

By the time of the Tithe Maps in 1838 the name was Shagden and the land was owned by William Sparkes, but occupied by Hugh Russell, who farmed land from the Green Man down to Ganghill, on both sides of the London Road. By 1851 the farm was being run by Charles Gosden – could he have been connected to Gosden Hill Farm?

The farm was sold in 1870, described as "a very pretty modern family residence with a newly erected lodge entrance, carriage drive, pleasure grounds, orchard..." including a granary, cow-house, piggeries and an orchard. The stock was also sold, including cows, horses, pigs and chickens. In the 1871 census it was owned by Catherine Ward, an American from New York, living with

her three children. By 1891 Albert Coote was running the farm, then Percy Smeed – described as a retired farmer, aged 24 years! During the 20th Century residents included Georgiana Skirrow Richardson, Frank Eve, Robert Dickie and Robert Cox. The last farmer of Weylea was J S Heard in 1975.

In 1973 Weylea Developments submitted a planning application for over 300 houses, shops and flats to be built on the 47 acre plot, alongside the proposed A3 diversion, on land that wasn't approved for residential purposes. After getting through some objections, the foundations were laid by Ideal Homes, designed by John Reynolds & Associates, Architects, and in 1981 the advertisements said "See Weylea Farm Guildford – Where everyone wants to live".

All the homes were built with advanced energy saving features to cut fuel bills, maintenance and housework! Prices ranged from £26,000 to £75,000.



In June 1983 Guildford Mayor Rosemary Hall cut the ribbon to release 100 helium balloons to celebrate the Coming of Age – 21 months since work started. The first purchasers were Michael Goldberg and Janice Patrick. Plans for the future included a scheme for the active elderly with a resident caretaker and a number of large family houses backing onto Abbotswood.

Today, looking from London Road, much of the estate is hidden by trees and a wall. It has been extended over the years, to include Gatley Drive, and finishes down by the Village Hall on Burpham Lane.

And I guess that probably sums up the Christian faith for me. God really is involved in all those little everyday encounters, in real relationships with real people. I got the surprise of my life when I discovered (aged 16) that Christianity wasn't about assenting to a whole host of religious statements, but actually about getting to know God and being known. I felt like life had gone from being in black and white to in colour - a whole new depth to life opened up to me. ## Things to do in the garden in March.

Shallots and Onion sets should be planted this month and if it is mild Early Potatoes can be planted towards the end of the month.

#### Most vegetable seed can now be sown outdoors if it is mild in prepared beds.

- Most vegetable seed can now be sown outdoors if it is mild in prepared beds.
- If you did not do so last month you can still sow Aubergines, Cucumbers, Sweet Peppers and Tomatoes in a heated propagator or indoors.

#### When conditions are dry the lawn should be cut with the mower blades on a high setting for the first few cuts...

Cut back last years Autumn fruiting Raspberry canes to ground level, prune Blueberries and Gooseberries and apply a dressing of a balanced fertiliser or Sulphate of Potash at 15g per sg m.

- Bush and Standard Roses should be pruned and fed with a Rose Fertiliser.
- Continue to prune Summer Flowering Shrubs and Dogwoods.
- When conditions are dry the lawn should be cut with the mower blades on a high setting for the first few cuts, Weed and Feed with Mosskiller should be applied just before rain is forecast.

# Things to do in the garden in April.

- Second Early Potatoes should be planted in the first half of the month, Maincrop Potatoes can be planted in the second half.
- Beetroot, Carrots, Leeks, Lettuce, Radish, Spring Onions and Turnip can all be sown outdoors now.
- Brassicas should be sown in small pots ready for transplanting later in the Summer.
- Plant out Broad Beans which were sown indoors.
- Tomato seedlings which have developed their first true leaves should be potted up. Plant Summer flowering bulbs such as Gladioli.

Remove faded Daffodil and Tulip flowers leaving the foliage to die back.

### Plant out Broad Beans which were sown indoors.

- Deadhead Pansy and other Spring bedding plants to encourage continuous flowering. Prune Forsythia immediately after flowering.
- Cut back Lavender to keep the plant bushy but do not cut into old wood.

#### Continue to apply Lawn Weed and Feed with Mosskiller as necessary.

- Pot up Dahlia Tubers to get an early start once the risk of frost has gone.
- In the Greenhouse sow bedding plants such as French Marigold for a Summer display.
- Continue to apply Lawn Weed and Feed with Mosskiller as necessary.
- Start checking for and controlling Slugs, Snails and Aphids.
