



Update from our local councillors

Our July and August issue includes a bi-monthly update from local councillors George Potter and Jane Tyson. Their goal is to keep the Burpham community informed about their actions as representatives of the Burpham Ward and how the Guildford Borough Council is supporting our local area.

Local councillors George Potter and Jane Tyson write:

As this is our first update since being elected in May, we would like to thank everyone who voted in the recent election, and especially those who supported us. With the election over, our number one priority is working to represent all residents of Burpham ward and doing the best job we possibly can for the local community.

we will be happy to do all we can to help. We will also be running monthly drop-in sessions so residents can come to speak to us in person on the first Saturday of every month from 10 to 11.30am at Burpham Bowling Club.

Riverside Nature Reserve

We've been aware of a number of complaints about the work being carried out at the reserve, which are causing particular problems for wheelchair users.

Council staff agree that the quality of the work by their contractor has fallen short of expectations, so are working to get things put right. More broadly, the council plans to make significant improvements to the reserve in the next couple of years and will soon be getting ready to consult local people on what we'd like to see happen.

Sutherland Memorial Park

On the positive side, things are moving ahead with plans for the Burpham Community Hub project to take over management of the community hall from the council, and it is looking like the hall will re-open to the public this summer. On the less positive side, we are aware of ongoing frustrations with the way the astro courts are being managed, and we will be having discussions with council officers about what can be done to improve things.

News from Millmead

Guildford Borough Council's offices are located at Millmead, and a couple of big items are coming up at Millmead in July. We are expecting a planning application for a revised North Street scheme to be submitted, and there will also be a special budget to tackle a budget gap created by the combination of government funding cuts, inflation, and rising interest rates. We will be watching both issues closely, and hope to update you as soon as there are more details to share.

Burpham Tennis community unite to try and stop Guilford Borough Council closing courts down.

On Tuesday 30th May, over 60 locals came down to Sutherland Memorial Park to play some tennis and show their support for the new Burpham Community Tennis initiative, supported by Burpham Community Hub.

With a fantastically diverse range of players from 3yr olds having a go for the first time, up to very handy 70+yr old Burpham Tennis Club legends, fun coaching and matches were organised by local Tennis expert **Matt Trevail**, along with the assistance of Burpham Coach **Ben Halstead**.

Many Burpham residents were left in shock at Guildford Borough Councils recent communication to regular users at the Park that all courts would be closed from April-October going forwards and a £15k fence needed to be erected at the tax payers expense to segregate one tennis court from multi-use football pitches for summer time use only. All with zero consultation with local constituents!

Complaints to the council have been all too often about the poor booking system and management structure for sports facilities in the area (leading

to the unfortunate folding of Burpham Tennis Club during the pandemic), so Burpham Community Hub were keen to help FIGHT BACK!

Many Burpham residents were left in shock at Guildford Borough Councils recent communication to regular users at the Park that all courts would be closed from April-October going forwards...

Although they could not stop the council wasting so much money on a fence, they're keen to show GBC that a local community group can easily get court use thriving again alongside the football, like it is around the country at present (Tennis in the UK has grown by over a million players in the last 3yrs!). With free community tennis

initiatives and online booking systems like those successfully running in so many other Parks around the country with the support of the Lawn Tennis Association, lookout for Social Tennis, Junior Coaching, Cardio Tennis & more at Burpham Community Tennis...

Guildford in Bloom Crowdfunding Appeal in Crisis

Guildford in Bloom's crowdfunding appeal has hit problems, when they were told only £3000 match funding would be added to the fund.

Initial promotion of the scheme suggested match funding was likely to be 50% up to a maximum of £10,000. Therefore **Guildford in Bloom** started a campaign to fund 2023 and 2024 with a total of just over £22,000 to be raised.

At this point in time, with just one month to go until the campaign ends, it was anticipated that only £1000 would need to be raised to reach target, but now £8000 needs to be raised in just 30 days.

Since January 2022 Guildford has been an independent Association, entirely reliant on loyal and generous sponsors, but with increased costs and no steady financial support, there is a shortfall in the funding putting its long term future in jeopardy. Guildford in Bloom is run entirely by a dedicated team of volunteers.

Guildford in Bloom was determined to keep its competitions for residents, community groups, schools and businesses free to enter. Part of the Guildford in Bloom ethos is to encourage diverse habitats that encourage and protect wildlife, especially our pollinators. Creating pollinator pitstops and wildlife areas in gardens is key to the Guildford in Bloom ethos to help reverse the decline in numbers.


Guildford in

gardening into the curriculum and supporting teachers to do this. For them to continue to do this – they must reach our crowdfunding target. If they don't reach target, they don't get to keep any of the fantastic pledges already made.

The **Blooming Picnic** in the Castle Grounds is also a Guildford in Bloom event in partnership with **Guildford Fringe Festival** and **Experience Guildford**. It is important that this event remains free for the community to attend. This year it was attended by around 1500 people who enjoyed free entertainment from the bandstand, and provided a platform for local charities and businesses to get exposure.

Cllr Paul Spooner, Chairman of Guildford in Bloom says:

"Guildford in Bloom has been an integral part of Guildford's community



for almost 42 years – and has meant so much to so many people to see their efforts rewarded. We intended to raise enough funding to allow us to expand next year with more events promoting wildlife and ecofriendly horticultural practices.

We have done incredibly well so far thanks to some fantastically generous donations, but it is just not enough, and the amount of match funding from Guildford Borough Council is extremely disappointing leaving us in this critical position.

We appeal to everyone who has been involved in Guildford in Bloom, both past and present to help us by pledging to our crowdfunding appeal and sharing this as far as possible."

It must be stressed that enough money has been raised to ensure that 2023 will go on as planned, culminating in an Awards ceremony at the Yvonne Arnaud Theatre on 5 September where all entrants will receive their awards.

2024 however, is seriously in jeopardy with the Guildford in Bloom team seriously considering whether it can continue in its current form.





Why were all those tankers around Lawrence Close?

This question was being asked on Nextdoor a month or so back, so here is the answer.

On 2nd August 2022 a leak on the A3 was reported to Thames Water. Nothing was done until 3rd March 2023 when the BCA Flood Forum reported it to the authorities. Immediate action was taken and on inspection it was estimated that the leak had been present for at

least three years. Engineers believe the power cut in late January that affected many of you was as a direct result of this leak, which was in excess of 75,000 gallons.

A report was since been written and recommendations have been put to the Environment Agency to ensure it never happens on any rising main in the country. If you would like a copy of the report please contact

the Secretary. Our thanks to McAllister for their professionalism in what turned out to be a varied and complicated job.

The tankers should not be needed in Lawrence Close until the new sewer pipe for Gosden Hill Estate is installed, however you may see them late at night as they try and cope with the lack of capacity at Moorfields Sewage Works.

We are currently heavily involved in several issues, including: the London Road Active Travel Scheme, restoring Sutherland Memorial Hall to full community use, and the development proposed for Gosden Hill Farm (see separate article). These, and no doubt many other potential problems, will need to be monitored and appropriate action taken to protect the community for months and years ahead. Currently this is being done by a handful of people and it's hard work.

This proposed development comprises some 1,700 dwellings, some commercial buildings (light industry, retail) and community facilities (schools, surgery, recreation).

Although it is expected to be several years before any building begins, it is clear that the developers are hoping

to proceed with the development.
The photo is just one suggested possible layout but it gives some idea of the extent of the development.

The BCA has several concerns about this proposal: they include the provision of power, water supply and sewage capacity; the safe and effective access for vehicles, bicycles and pedestrians and the impact of increased traffic on Burpham and surrounding areas.

Martin Grant Homes, the developer and owner of the site has submitted a planning application requesting opinions on the scoping of its Environmental Impact Assessment. The BCA and the Burpham Neighbourhood Forum will be studying this in detail and making comments where necessary.

The developer has requested a meeting with the BCA, stating: "Over the summer, we will be holding briefings, workshops and consultation events on the proposal and we look forward to meeting elected members, community groups, local residents and businesses."

As this progresses, the BCA may well need to ask for additional volunteers and additional funding to help ensure that any development includes the necessary infrastructure and limits the adverse impact on Burpham.

Burpham Village Hall

Moira MacQuaide's history of Burpham

In 1922, the land that we now know as Sutherland Memorial Park was owned by the Duke of Sutherland. At that time the only places for Burpham residents to gather were the two pubs. The Vicar felt that a village hall was needed.

The land, where the Church Room already stood, was leased from the Duke for one shilling per year and Reverend Storr learned that surplus war materials were being auctioned at Thursley Army Camp where an unused wooden hospital ward, with a dispensary attached, was discovered. The whole building cost £180.

The Vicar, and local farmer George Gatley, had the building transported to Burpham, where it was left on the muddy grass, due to the heavy rain. for several months. The image of a flat pack, waiting for someone to put it together, comes to mind!

Once built, a couple of tortoise stoves, so named because fuel burned so slowly in them, were put in to provide heating and the new community facility was ready to go.

Improvements have been made to the hall over the years, including a new stove, flooring and roof lining after the war.

The first caretaker was Mrs Marshman; minor repairs were done by members of the committee, though contractors were brought in for bigger works.
By 1923 the Trustees for the Village
Hall included Mr CH Binsted, Mr HC
Binsted, Mr H Kerr, Rev. A Theodosius,
Mr A Berry, Mr J Archer and Mr P
Gatley. Mr Bidwell was Honorary
Secretary and his wife ran the
Scouts group.

In 1940 the lease was agreed for a further 99 years, and the rent kept at one shilling per year. Apparently, the minute books for committee meetings in the early years made fascinating reading, but they were thrown away as valueless by Mr Gatley's executors.

Over the last 100 years the hall has been used for a wide variety of events, including whist drives, Women's Institute meetings, Mothers' Union, Old Time Dance Club, birthday and wedding parties, Guildford Photographic Society, and during the war it was used for Burpham Primary School children's lunches, as well as a mother and baby clinic.

In recent years a major user of the facilities has been Guildford u3a, which holds many of its group meetings held there. The hall is managed now by a committee of Trustees.

We have recently been carrying out some improvement work in St Luke's churchyard, a lovely quiet space between Sutherland Park and Burpham Primary School, which is surprisingly peaceful given how close it is to the A3.

The work in the churchyard, started by clearing brambles and felling some dead trees along the school boundary fence. We have also removed ivy growing on the wall of the church, and cleared a lot of rubbish – including a derelict shed – from inside the wooded area. Over the next few weeks, we are hoping to clear more of the edge of the wooded area, to reveal a number of old graves which have become lost in the trees. Going forward, we are hoping to do more work in the churchyard, to improve its visual appearance. This work should

also improve the biodiversity of the site, which is important because churchyards are recognised as being important wildlife sanctuaries.

Many residents visit to St Luke's churchyard to remember loved ones, we want it to be place that is honouring to their memory. To keep the churchyard tidy we have placed a bin for the wrappings from flowers near the entrance on Burpham Lane and have created a new compost area behind the church for flowers that are past their best. We would ask that visitors make use of these.

We invite you to come and enjoy the tranquillity of St Luke's churchyard, maybe even turn off your phone and simply be still. While you sit you may find it helpful to think about these words of Jesus; "I tell you not to worry about your life. Don't worry about having something to eat, drink, or wear. Isn't life more than food or clothing? Look at the birds in the sky! They don't plant or harvest. They don't even store grain in barns. Yet your Father in heaven takes care of them. 






Dean of Guildford, Dianna Gwilliams to retire.

Things to do in the garden in July.

- Remove the main stem of Cordon Tomatoes just above the fourth truss, any fruit that forms above this truss is unlikely to ripen before winter sets in.
- Spray Potatoes and Tomatoes when it is wet and muggy to reduce the risk of blight damage.
- A regular feed of Tomorite will help Tomatoes and Dahlias to produce good fruit and flowers, start feeding Tomatoes as soon as the first fruit starts to set, do not water at irregular times as this will encourage blossom end rot in the fruit.
- Continue to make successional sowings of Salad Crops
- Regularly pick Courgettes unless you wish the fruit to become Marrows.
- French and Runner Beans will become tough and stringy unless they are picked frequently.
- Spring Cabbage, Turnip and a final batch of French and Runner Beans should now be sown outdoors.

 Leeks and Winter Brassicas should be planted out this month.

- Give Summer Bedding Plants and containerised plants a regular Liquid feed.
- Dead head Bedding Plants to maintain a colourful display and Perennials to obtain a second flush of bloom.
- Once containerised Camellias and Rhododendrons have finished flowering keep them well watered to enable good flowering next year.

Things to do in the garden in August.

Now that all the hard work has been done it is time to sit back and to enjoy your garden. which should now be at the peak of perfection.

Set the mower blades on high when cutting the grass during dry periods.

- Continue to harvest fast growing Vegetables and Salad crops as they mature.
- Keep Runner Beans well watered which will help the flowers to set.
- Norease the feeding of Tomatoes.
- 💊 Lift Maincrop Potatoes.

- Rambling Roses which only flower once a year should be pruned after flowering, cutting out one in three stems from the base to encourage new growth.
- Summer prune Wisteria, removing all new shoots to five buds above the main stem.
- Now is the time to take cuttings of Buddleia, Hydrangea and Pyracantha.
- Cut back Perennials which have collapsed onto the lawn, path or other plants.
- Now is the time to set Earwig traps amongst your Dahlias, fill a 3" pot with hay or straw and place it upside down on the end of the cane supporting the plant, the Earwigs will climb into the pot during the night and will be waiting for you to shake them out into a dish in the morning for disposal.
- This month you can start collecting seed from Annuals ready for sowing next Spring, do not collect the seed of F1 hybrids as they will not produce flowers true to type next year.
- Set the mower blades on high when cutting the grass during dry periods.


