



The consultation was originally meant to end on 13th November but will now run until 27th November due to delays with sending out letters to local households to let people know about the consultation.

#### Planting new trees

Additionally, Surrey County Council have happily announced that they are about to scrap the £25 fee they currently charge residents for requesting a new tree on their street. #### **Guildford borough council** announces balanced budget

In our previous updates we've talked about the big financial challenges facing Guildford borough council and that, unless urgent savings were made, the council faced declaring bankruptcy this year by issuing a 'section 114' notice. But this month we have some positive news for a change! The council finance team have confirmed that we have managed to balance the budget for the current year and avoid the immediate threat of bankruptcy.

However, there is still a great deal of work left to do to get the council back to financial stability, and this will unfortunately have to include some difficult choices over the next few years. But obtaining a balanced budget this year and avoiding bankruptcy means that those choices will be made by local councillors, who are accountable to local people, rather than by government-appointed commissioners as is happening in Woking.

## Get strong. You'll like it!

Christine Sciberras, Founder and Head Coach at Melita Fitness

Strength training is important. I bang on about it. Muscle mass. Bone density. You know.

But what we don't talk about enough is that it just feels so good. And why you'll like it! Because you will!

#### The ability to do things!

There's the sheer satisfaction of doing things that require strength: the ability to lift heavy stuff, the ability to move shift furniture if needed. But also, the ability...



#### **Market Comment**

3rd October 2023

After a quiet summer period, we were all hoping for the return of the traditionally busy September market. However, activity was muted as buyers waited to see what the Bank of England did with the base rate, when they met on the 20th of September. The news that the Bank held the base rate at 5.25% has given buyers a little more confidence that rates have now peaked and may even start to fall a little in 2024. This has translated into a gentle uplift in activity in the housing market, both in terms of viewings and sales agreed. Motivated sellers, who take a pragmatic view on their price will most probably fund a buyer this autumn, but we will only have until the end of November before the market shuts down until Spring.

I think a quiet second half of 2023 will mean that there will be pent-up demand, which should ensure the Spring 2024 market is busy. The likely downwards pressure on interest rates as inflation continues to drop will give buyers renewed confidence and we should see more buoyancy in the market. We have an election to contend with next year and that usually means that activity cools off for a couple of weeks either side of polling day – let's hope they cut the housing market some slack and don't decide to hold it in May, right in the middle of our busiest period!!

#### **Japanese Knotweed**

Guildford has been identified as one of Surrev's knotweed hotspots this year; 90 infestations have been reported, 42 of them within 4km of the town centre.

It is incredibly invasive - even a small piece of the root can generate a new plant and it's very difficult to eradicate. Knotweed can damage property and reduce the value of your home. We know that it has been found along Clay Lane and is now being dealt with by National Highways but it will take several years to clear it completely. How did it get there well, it usually spreads from garden

waste that has not been properly disposed of, or could even have been deliberately dumped.

If you think you have knotweed in your garden, you are not legally required to report it but you can be prosecuted if you let it spread to your neighbour's garden. Contact GBC if you see it on council land. If you want information to help you identify it, there are many useful websites www.japaneseknotweed.co.uk is very informative, with lots of pictures showing the very distinct seasonal changes and they, and other websites, offer a free identification service.

## Lords of the Manor of Burpham

Moira MacQuaide's history of Burpham

Traditionally, most Manors were compact areas, centring around the Manor House, surrounded by the village church and tenants' dwellings. Around these would be cultivated land, owned by the Lord of the Manor and farmed by the tenants. However, Burpham Manor was not compact, as it stretched from the Woking Road in Jacobs Well, to the top of New Inn Lane.



Minutes of Court Baron 1645

The earliest records show that in 1276AD the Manor of Burgham was given to William de Wintershull, and it stayed in that family until 1548, when it passed to Sir Anthony Windsor. By 1592 it passed to Sir John Wolley, who was an MP for Surrey. He was one of

the commissioners who tried and sentenced to death Mary, Queen of Scots. He was also the Latin Secretary to Queen Elizabeth I, translating official documents – a job later held by the poet John Milton. His son Francis Wolley inherited, then in 1609 he bequeathed the Manor of Burpham to his illegitimate daughter Mary – a very unusual move. On her death the Manor passed to her half-brother Robert Wroth, who was MP for Guildford in the early 18th century.

When Robert Wroth died in 1720, Thomas, 2nd Baron Onslow, bought the Manor and it passed down through generations of the Onslow family, until much of the estate was sold in 1905.


The Manorial system enabled a sophisticated way of functioning in medieval England. Courts Baron were responsible for the internal regulation of the Manor, chaired by the Steward and would have a jury, known as the Homage. The courts would record changes in land transactions, resolve disputes


between tenants, and regulate local agricultural practices. Surrey History Centre holds an example of minutes of the 1645 Court Baron, written in Latin, and rather hard to decipher. They also hold an example from 1858, and a number of names and places are recognisable in recent Burpham history. It is unclear where the Manorial Courts were held in Burpham, but it's likely to have been either Burpham Court Farm or Burpham Court House.

Some Lordships of Manors fall into disuse and are forgotten. The Manorial Society warns people against several websites, which claim to offer Lordships for sale to the unsuspecting public. The Society's records show that in 1938 William, 6th Earl Onslow, was Lord of the Manor for Burpham.

The 1944/5 Kelly's Directory recorded that "The Manors of Worplesdon and Burpham belong to the Earl Onslow", so the title was probably inherited by Rupert, 8th Earl Onslow, after his father's death in 2011. ■

## Burpham Gardening Hints & Tips November & December

## Things to do in the garden in November.

- The Planting of Tulips should be completed by the end of this month.
- Cut down faded perennials leaving Penstemon and other late flowering perennials to continue flowering.
- Dahlias and Cannas can still be lifted and stored in a dry place if you do not want to risk frost damage by overwintering them in the ground. they should be lifted, dried and stored in a frost free place ready for planting next Spring, if they are being overwintered in the ground they should be covered with a mulch dressing.
- Apply an application of a mulch dressing to protect Agapanthus from the frost.

## The watering of Houseplants should be reduced as the nights draw in.

- Half hardy Fuchsias and Pelargoniums should be cut back and brought undercover, reduce watering so that they remain dormant during the winter months.
- The watering of Houseplants should be reduced as the nights draw in.
- Amaryllis bulbs should be potted up for Christmas flowering.
- Bring potted Hyacinths into a light cool area once they begin to shoot.

- Reduce the watering of Houseplants.
- Now is a good time to plant Raspberry Canes, Fruit Trees and Bushes.
- Start the winter pruning of Apple and Pear trees.

## Continue to rake fallen leaves off of the lawn.

- Aquadulce Broad Beans should be planted now to produce an early crop ahead of the Spring invasion of Blackfly.
- Garlic cloves and overwintering Onion Sets can still be planted.
- Continue to rake fallen leaves off of the lawn.

## Things to do in the garden in December.

Indoor Azaleas should be watered frequently to prevent the dense root ball from drying out, rainwater is better than tap water.

Houseplants should be kept in a bright place as winter light levels fall ,on frosty nights do not leave them trapped between closed curtains and the window.

Poinsettias are a popular gift at this time of the year, they should be kept in a warm light place away from

- draughts, they do not like to be overwatered. All other Houseplants should be kept in a bright place as winter light levels fall ,on frosty nights do not leave them trapped between closed curtains and the window.
- Pinch out the tips of Sweet Peas sown in October to encourage bushy growth.
- The vegetable plot should be cleared of all left over plant debris and lightly dug over to open up the ground so that the winter frost can get in and destroy bugs and diseases.

#### Keep off of the Lawn when it is frosty or very wet to prevent damage.

- Rhubarb crowns can be forced by covering them with dark bucket.
- Grape vines, Acers and Birches should be pruned before Christmas to prevent bleeding, most decidious trees can now be cut back, leave Prunus species until they are in leaf next Spring, Magnolias should be left until the Summer
- Neep off of the Lawn when it is frosty or very wet to prevent damage.
