Matrix is a youth charity with a mission to support and uplift young people across Guildford Borough.



Established for nearly 25 years, Matrix helps young people catalyse change by nurturing, inspiring, connecting and empowering them.



What can this support look like? **Matrix** provides projects and opportunities for vulnerable and at-risk youth both in schools through 1-2-1 sessions and in the community through hubs, workshops, work experience, traineeships and their **Youth Café** at **The Hideaway**. Through these projects

they aim to create safe spaces for young people where they can connect, learn and grow as individuals.



Over the last year Matrix worked with almost 2000 young people in both schools and across the community – supporting them with their mental health and wellbeing through 15



different projects. A Year 10 student expressed about their 1-2-1 sessions: "They do help, it is good to talk about things. We were honoured and moved to attend this year's Remembrance Service at St. Luke's Church in Burpham Lane to remember Burpham's war dead. With ongoing conflict and death in Ukraine, Israel-Palestine and elsewhere in the world it feels more important than ever to remember the horrors of war and to do all we can to strive for just and lasting peace. Thank you very much to Burpham Church and all the volunteers for organising and running such a lovely service.

We hope that everyone has been having a relaxing and peaceful holiday season, full of Christmas cheer. But, unfortunately, we also know that for many this time of year can be one of hardship. If you, or anyone you know

London Road & Burpham Lane

The public consultation on the muchdebated proposals for an active travel scheme along London Road has now ended. We have been told that the County Council will be reviewing the consultation responses in January before deciding how/whether to proceed. We continue to support the principle of making walking and cycling safer along the London Road, but as local councillors we will be working to ensure that County authorities listen to the wide range of views expressed and, in particular, properly address any wellfounded practical problems with their proposed scheme.

Separately, after lengthy delays, we have been able to secure a new battery for the vehicle activated signage (VAS) on Burpham Lane, where a speed limit review (organised by George Potter as county councillor) is also due to take place in the next few months with a view to potentially reducing the speed limit to 20mph.

Planning update

It has been a busy couple of months when it comes to planning! We were delighted to see such a good turnout at the BCA's update on local planning matters, and we're hoping it will be possible for another to be organised in the spring. In October planning permission was granted for the 471-flat North Street scheme in the town centre. This approval was as a result of amendments to the scheme which included reducing the height by two storeys, increasing the amount of affordable housing in the scheme, and a re-design of the proposed new bus station. Separately, the Gosden Hill development proposals on the edge of Burpham appear to have slowed down, with Martin Grant Homes recently announcing that their consultation on their plans for the site has been delayed until summer 2024.

Getting Guildford's finances in order

Although Guildford borough council is still struggling with challenging financial pressures, we are pleased to report that, as a result of strict financial controls and a large reduction in planned borrowing, the gap in the council's budget over the next four years has been reduced by more than half to £7.3 million. This budget gap is still challenging, and will require difficult choices to be made, but to have made this much progress so quickly is really encouraging and bodes well for the council's ability to balance its books long-term without needing to cut essential public services.

Boots Pharmacy in Kingfisher Drive to close

Despite Angela Richardson MP trying to intervene, Boots has decided to go ahead with the planned closure of their Kingfisher Drive pharmacy early in the New Year.

This has left the local residents of Burpham dismayed, especially since they have already lost Lloyds Pharmacy from within the Clay Lane Sainsbury's. Now, they have to travel even further to collect their prescriptions from already highly busy pharmacies in the Guildford area.

Angela Richardson wrote to Boots' Senior Vice President & Managing Director voicing local patients concerns over the pharmacy closure and asking him to reconsider. Following this, she had discussions with Boots' Healthcare Development & Public Affairs Director, Head of Public Affairs and Regional Pharmacy Manager to discuss the matter.

Whilst Boots did review the situation they decided to proceed with the closure. We await to see if the Integrated Care Board (ICB) can extend the pharmaceutical contract to another party.

Most patients are being offered to have their nominated NHS pharmacy moved to either of the nearer options being Boots Pharmacy on Epsom Road or Boots Pharmacy on Stoughton Road. If these options are not suitable, there are slightly further options within 2 miles of Burpham, which include Villages Medical Centre on Send Barns Lane and St. Luke's Surgery

on Warren Road. Beyond that, there

are the town centre pharmacies.

Sutherland Memorial Hall

The BCA, along with other local groups (known collectively as the Burpham Community Hub) has been working hard to get the Hall back in use for all of the community.

The first task was to get registered as a charity and we are very pleased to announce that this was achieved last November. Now the less good news. At the beginning of this process GBC were asked to confirm that they could issue two leases on the same premises – ours as well as the existing lease to the nursery. We were told

this would be fine. GBC now say this information was wrong and it cannot be done. Instead they will change the nursery lease to a licence – this may take some time – and the Community Hub will be granted a lease. This will allow both organisations to share the Hall and make optimum use of it for the community.

The Running River

This is the Running River which flows from Stoke Lock to Sutton Place. The planners of Weyside Urban Village describe it variously as "an unlicensed drain" and "an open sewer."

Well, it may look pretty foul these days but it has a noble history which begins in Sutton Place.

The manor was granted to Sir Richard Weston by Henry VIII in 1521. His great great grandson was also Sir Richard Weston, born in 1591. He spent some time in the Netherlands where he became interested in inland navigation and how locks work. This gave him the idea of using locks to make the River Wey navigable

We represent the community of Burpham, Guildford

from Weybridge to Guildford. As a Catholic and Royalist, his property was sequestrated during the Civil War and he went into exile. He was able to return to England during the 1640s and instigated a bill in parliament to authorise construction of the Wey navigation – a massive undertaking finally completed in 1653.

Sir Richard was also responsible for creating the Running River, using the techniques he had discovered – water meadows kept the ground warm in winter and the river irrigated fields between Stoke Lock and the north side of Sutton Place in the summer. He also made many agricultural improvements including this irrigation scheme and crop rotation.

Maps of the early 1960s show the course of the Running River but the Slyfield dump and the industrial estate destroyed the centre section. The land is currently owned by GBC and Thames Water who are involved in the Weyside Urban Village project. We have been told that the Running River will be integrated into the Village as an historical asset.

Our thanks go to Jim Allen who has worked hard on behalf of the BCA and Burpham Neighbourhood Forum to help preserve Sir Richard Weston's incredible legacy.

Joint BCA/BNF Public Meeting

November 2nd 2023

Guildford Fruit Farm, Burpham & Hugh Lancelot Robson

Moira MacQuaide's history of Burpham

If you're trying to find Guildford Fruit Farm nowadays, you're more likely to come across either Manor Fruit Farm in Normandy or Nuthill Fruit Farm in Send. These two venues are pick-your-own farms or farm shops where you can buy or pick the fruit you want. However, in the early 20th century, Burpham had its own fruit farm called Guildford Fruit Farm.

Winter Hill Coppice was a woodland area shown on maps in the 19th century, but before World War One, the rest of the farm was mainly arable land, most likely used for wheat cultivation. The orchard was developed on the southwestern part of Winterhill Farm, where Orchard Road is now.

Hugh Lancelot Robson owned the orchard from 1911 to 1924. According to newspaper adverts, apples, plums, and loganberries were grown and sold, along with probably many other fruits. Hugh lived in Orchard Cottage, which was situated between the brickfield and London Road, along New Inn Lane. This land was acquired in 1958 to provide housing for a Catholic priest in Burpham. Hugh was born in 1882 in Guildford, and his father was a Clerk in Holy Orders. He was always interested

in horticulture and was a student at Wisley. He was also very involved in animal welfare. Hugh managed the fruit farm and had a foreman, Norman Arthur Phillips, who is better known as one of the names on the **Burpham War Memorial**. Norman joined the Royal Flying Corps in 1916 and was the only officer among the Burpham fallen and the only one not in the army.

After 1924, the fruit farm seems to have vanished from the records, although Winterhill Farm continued as a working farm until 1934, when the first adverts for housing on the Winterhill estate appeared. Hugh lived in **Echo Pit Road** from 1932 onwards, and in later years he became a trustee of the local **Poyle Charity**. He died in 1953 at St Thomas' Hospital in Hambledon, presumably from tuberculosis.

Guildford Poyle Charities

Guildford Poyle Charities was established nearly 400 years ago by Henry Smith (b. Wandsworth 1549) who left money in his will to help vulnerable people in need or distress in Guildford upon his death in 1628. His legacy was invested wisely in property in the town known as the Poyle Estate which today is the Old Town Mill and Pewley areas of the town. Since then it has sold most of this land.

Over the years, the charity has amalgamated with a number of smaller charities with aims similar to its own. Some of these charities date back to the 17th Century. This includes the Will of John How who bequeathed £400 upon his death circa 1676 and a later bequest left by John Parsons on his death in 1703. Annually the Charity conducts the 'Dicing Money Ceremony' in keeping with the Wills of these two men. The ceremony which has been taking place in Guildford for over 300 years involves two dice being thrown and the loser 'wins' a slightly higher sum of money.

The Charity's first formal constitution was published on 27 June 1879 when a Scheme was registered with the Charity Commission, a fledgling body which had been established 26 years previously. A number of revised editions of this Scheme ensued over the next 130 years although the format of the Scheme remained much the same. In

2011 the charity completely revised its constitution and objects to bring them up-to-date with modern thinking. However, its work and those it helps have not changed in essence and it still stays true to its ancient purpose of helping the most vulnerable in Guildford.

The Charity remains committed to its original ideals and today distributes around 250 grants annually to help people in need with items they would not otherwise be able to afford. The Charity also gives grants to organisations working with such people in Guildford.



Burpham Gardening Hints & Tips

January & February

I wish you all a successful year in your garden in 2024. John Boon.

Things to do in the garden in January.

If you cannot garden because the soil is rain sodden or frosted you can use your time by studying plant catalogues which have arrived in the post on a regular basis.

...remember that this year's novelty seeds are likely to be next year's ordinary seeds.

The same advice applies as when ordering spring/early summer flowering plants, the larger the plants you buy the better they will be when planted out in May. If you only need a few plants it would probably be better to visit a local nursery such as Elm Nursery at Sutton Green in May where you can select your plants first hand. New seed varieties which are usually F1 Hybrids are expensive to buy and often difficult to germinate, so look on the back of the packet to see how many seeds you are buying for your money, remember that this year's novelty seeds are likely will be next year's ordinary seeds.

Whilst the fruit buds are still dormant Apple and Pear trees can be pruned, cut out any congested growth to increase airflow which will improve the quality of next seasons fruit, cut back to a fruit bud which is large and rounded on older growth, one year old shoots should be pruned back to a slender bud.

Things to do in the garden in February.

- Plunge shrivelled Dahlia tubers into a bucket of tepid water overnight, having removed any rotten tubers, they can then be started into growth to provide cuttings for new plants, place the tubers in a seed tray or pot and lightly cover with damp soil.
- Slow germinating annuals such as Antirrhinum and Lobelia should be sown indoors.
- Prune Summer flowering deciduous shrubs such as Buddleia which flower on the current year's growth. Cut back Summer and Autumn flowering Clematis to the lowest pair of strong buds.

- Sow Sweet Peas and pot on those sown in the Autumn.
- When it is mild Broad Beans, Carrots and Parsnips can be sown under cloches.

- Sow Greenhouse Tomatoes, Cucumbers and Peppers at 21°C.
- Seed Potatoes should be placed on their ends in a light, cool, frost free place to sprout.
