

Sutherland Memorial Hall - Progress Report



The sign displayed on the wall inside the **Sutherland Memorial Hall** says it all: "This hall is for the use and benefit of the Burpham Community".

Two months ago there was every indication to believe that the newly-formed Burpham Community Hub would have the keys for Sutherland Memorial Hall early in 2024, and that plans for many enjoyable and exciting community events would be well underway.

However, there has been another bump in the road, causing further delays to developments.

Despite having 'Heads of Terms' (an agreement in principle between two parties, but which are subject to a formal contract) with Guildford Borough Council for Burpham Community Hub to manage the property last year, the project has once again shifted to another silo at the Council for sign off. This time it went to Finance.

From the outset we were assured we would be able to have the hall for a peppercorn and that Guildford

Borough Council would bear the utility costs given we would be servicing the community of Burpham, and also because the nursery, that are currently the only organisation to have been granted a lease for the building, is not charged for utilities as part of its lease arrangement.

GBC's finance team has taken Guildford Borough Council's wider financial situation into account, and will not now honour the agreement made.

Therefore, in order to proceed, Burpham Community Hub now has to apply for a grant to cover the costs of its use of the utilities. (We are assured by the Guildford Borough Council that money has been set aside for this to cover most of the anticipated utility costs for year one, so all being well this is just a formality).

A property such as Sutherland Memorial Hall can not have multiple leases held upon it, so GBC will issue a new licence. which will replicate the established and agreed terms, to replace the lease, currently held by the nursery, plus a new licence for Burpham Community Hub. The current lease, held by the nursery, is subject to a six-month break clause, which should they opt to take up on presents us with another long wait. We are hoping that the owners of the nursery can see the general community benefit that Burpham Community Hub represents and that they can help cut the time by simply switching over to the new licence without delay. However, if this is not the case, we will be asking GBC if we can have some access to the hall as a good will gesture over this six-month period.

Stop press... News just in: it looks like we are working towards getting the keys at Easter – fingers crossed.

All we can say with certainty is that it remains our endeavour to secure the hall for the community it was built for, as indicated on the sign displayed in the premises (pictured) and we appreciate any support you can offer.

March & April bi-monthly update from local councillors George Potter and Jane Tyson.

Local councillors **George Potter** and **Jane Tyson** write their regular update for Burpham residents:

Drop in to see us!

So far it's been a pretty quiet start to the new year in Burpham, but one change this year is that we have moved our monthly drop-ins to take place at 10am to 11.30am on the first Saturday of every month at **M & R Barber + Brew** at the Kingpost shopping parade. If you've got anything you would like to talk to us about, or would just like a chat over a tea or coffee, please pop in to see us.

Borough council passes balanced budget

In February the council passed a balanced budget for the upcoming financial year. The budget includes a 2.99% increase in the borough council's share of council tax (which is about 9% of council tax collected). The budget also includes a big improvement in the council's finances with the medium term budget gap reduced from £18 million to £2.4 million over the next four years. Closing that gap will still be challenging, but this rapid turnaround means that the council has avoided the risk of bankruptcy.

London Road active travel scheme

By the time you read this the County Council will have made its decision about the **London Road active travel scheme** which proposes new cycle lanes, widened footpaths and more pedestrian crossings along the London Road. At time of writing we don't know for certain what the decision will be, but it looks likely that the Boxgrove

roundabout changes will go ahead, the Burpham section will only go ahead if an additional safety audit finds no issues, and the town centre section will be cancelled for the time being. A new pedestrian crossing on London Road near Winterhill Way, which we have been lobbying for, will also be built regardless of whether the rest of the Burpham section is built.

New Neighbourhood Plan for Burpham

Burpham's local **Neighbourhood Forum** has started the process of updating the **Neighbourhood Plan** which sets out policies to protect local green space, ensure minimum development standards and suggest possible locations for new development in Burpham. Public meetings to kick start the process, and to hear views from local people on what we want from our Neighbourhood Plan, will be organised for March or April.

20mph for Burpham Lane

A speed limit survey on Burpham Lane, commissioned by George as county councillor, has now been completed. The recommendation from highways engineers is to lower the speed limit along the road to 20mph, which local residents will be consulted on in the next few months. A lowering of the speed limit will go ahead if it is supported by residents.

Wildflower circles for Burpham

Finally, we were really pleased to have a great meeting recently with Ross (pictured with us above) from the **Surrey Wildlife Trust** where we talked about the idea of the trust and local volunteers planting circles of wildflowers around trees in Burpham. We are now both working on getting county and borough council blessing for this to take place on their land, and hope to report back about next steps soon!

What is that noise?



Sutherland Memorial Hall within Sutherland Memorial Park, Burpham.

That slow hammering noise you've been hearing for the past few months is the sound of machines compacting the ground that used to be the Slyfield landfill site, and more recently driving in the foundations for the new building.

This is so that it can bear the weight of the new sewage treatment works which are being moved from their current location near Stoke Lock to the north-east side of Slyfield industrial estate, closer to Clay Lane.

The work is carried out between 7am and 7pm and will go on until April

this year when attention shifts to the laying of new pipes, tunnels and foundations prior to shifting site, and all that will take until late 2026.

The new works will be nearer to us but more modern and effective and we're assured that the plant will be discretely hidden behind foliage. We hope this

will also mean the disappearance of unpleasant odours. These are caused by the fermentation of foul waters backing up in our local sewage pipes. The old works have insufficient treatment capacity, identified back in 2010, which is why tankers are shipping out waste to other treatment plants. This will continue until the new works are scheduled to come on line in late 2026 or early 2027.

As you can imagine, residents in the Jacobs Well and Slyfield areas are bearing the brunt of the noise and are in close contact with the council. The noise is also clearly audible in Burpham and the BCA is keeping an eye on this development as the noise pollution is worse than we expected - clearly audible indoors with windows closed.

Loss of recycling facilities

We are sorry to report that recycling bays have been closed at Burpham Sainsbury's in line with similar closures across the country. Sainsbury's say they are concentrating on services which cannot be provided elsewhere.

green bin, you have to take it to Slyfield tip which is less than convenient for non-drivers or disabled residents. In truth, the skips were emptied too infrequently and assorted rubbish built up in front of them in eyesore heaps. The problem is compounded by the closure of similar bins in Spectrum car park. One small consolation is that Sainsburys are offering a recycling bin instore for used plastic bags, as well as boxes at the exit for used batteries.

If you have a large amount of rubbish to get rid of, you may be considering using a waste removal company. Unscrupulous companies often resort to fly tipping, so please check that any company you use is fully licensed by the Environment Agency. That licence means that waste will be disposed of legally and safely. You can check if a waste carrier's licence is registered by looking at the EA's public register or calling 03708 506506. Failure to make proper checks can lead to a fine if your rubbish is fly tipped and can be traced back to you.



Burpham's Parade of Shops

Moira MacQuaide's history of Burpham

On the 1912 OS map of Burpham, the land opposite the Green Man, from New Inn Lane to the Anchor and Horseshoes, was all New Inn Farm land. The only buildings being New Inn Farm and Green Man Gate (the toll gate and house).

By 1934 the Kingpost Restaurant and swimming pool had appeared, but it's not known when this was built. The 1934 OS map seems to show the outline of the building for London Road Parade, and the Edward VIII postbox on the parade suggests that the post office was in place in 1936.

The first shops along this stretch of London Road were recorded in the 1938 Electoral Register, showing a Ladies' Hairdresser (Marianne), General Draper (Mrs Ryall), Newsagents (Arthur Manfield) and Grocers (Harold Kimber). For the next 15 years they were the only retailers in Burpham, but in 1953 they were joined by another Grocers (Burpham Stores) and Burpham Pharmacy. Then an Ironmongers (Purkiss), a Butcher (W Charles), a Fishmonger (Percy

Pettitt), and a Confectioner (Sid Sidey) were added to the row of shops now known as London Road Parade.

By 1961 the development of Kingpost Parade began, with Wines and Spirits (Carlos & Thrale), Antiques (J Hartley), Bakery (Coombes), Grocers (S Frost), Confectioners (Mussell & Co), Greengrocer (G Connor), Radio Dealer (Walton Electrics) and a Dry Cleaners (Elizabethan Cleaners). Over the years many of the names changed, and some of the shops changed - for example the Antique Dealer became Midland Bank (then HSBC). Those were the days when residents of Burpham had almost everything they needed in their own shops, within walking distance of home.

There were flats above the shops and it's likely that some of the shop staff lived there. Mr Evenden was manager at Kimber's grocers, and he lived above the shop. He would travel round Burpham collecting orders from customers, then goods would be delivered.

By the 1980s there were Penny's Hardware, where the Rajdoot is now; Howzat sports and school uniform, where Stevenson's is now; the Dutch Flower Shop; Video Hire shop; and the Tile Shop. By the late 1980s, competition from the new Sainsbury's meant that the chemist on the parade moved into the supermarket. Nowadays the bank has gone (replaced by a Tanning Salon), but there are three takeaways – the **Rajdoot** tandoori restaurant, **Seafare Fish & Chips** and the **Shangri La** Chinese takeaway. There's a **Wine Rack** off-licence a hairdresser and a barber, a funeral director, cycle shop, estate agent, and a carpet and flooring shop along

with many of the same type of shops as there were in the 1960s.

The London Road Parade and Kingpost Parade signs were erected in 2012, designed by Burrows Lea Forge.

In 2024 the residents of Burpham have a good selection of opportunities for retail therapy, with the Burpham Parade, Sainsbury's and Aldi.

Things to do in the garden in March.

- Shallots and Onion sets should be planted this month and if it is mild Early
- Potatoes can be planted towards the end of the month.

Most vegetable seed can now be sown outdoors if it is mild in prepared beds.

- Most vegetable seed can now be sown outdoors if it is mild in prepared beds.
- If you did not do so last month you can still sow Aubergines, Cucumbers, Sweet Peppers and Tomatoes in a heated propagator or indoors.

When conditions are dry the lawn should be cut with the mower blades on a high setting for the first few cuts...

Cut back last years Autumn fruiting Raspberry canes to ground level, prune Blueberries and Gooseberries and apply a dressing of a balanced fertiliser or Sulphate of Potash at 15g per sq m.

- Bush and Standard Roses should be pruned and fed with a Rose Fertiliser.
- Continue to prune Summer Flowering Shrubs and Dogwoods.
- When conditions are dry the lawn should be cut with the mower blades on a high setting for the first few cuts, Weed and Feed with Mosskiller should be applied just before rain is forecast.

Things to do in the garden in April.

- Second Early Potatoes should be planted in the first half of the month, Maincrop Potatoes can be planted in the second half.
- Beetroot, Carrots, Leeks, Lettuce, Radish, Spring Onions and Turnip can all be sown outdoors now.
- Brassicas should be sown in small pots ready for transplanting later in the Summer.
- Plant out Broad Beans which were sown indoors,
- Tomato seedlings which have developed their first true leaves should be potted up.
- Plant Summer flowering bulbs such as Gladioli.

Remove faded Daffodil and Tulip flowers leaving the foliage to die back.

Plant out Broad Beans which were sown indoors.

- Deadhead Pansy and other Spring bedding plants to encourage continuous flowering.
- Prune Forsythia immediately after flowering.
- Cut back Lavender to keep the plant bushy but do not cut into old wood.

Continue to apply Lawn Weed and Feed with Mosskiller as necessary.

- In the Greenhouse sow bedding plants such as French Marigold for a Summer display.
- Continue to apply Lawn Weed and Feed with Mosskiller as necessary.
- Start checking for and controlling Slugs, Snails and Aphids.
