Renovation work at the Yvonne Arnaud Theatre is now in full swing!

Their Play Your Part campaign to transform the theatre and develop this iconic and much-loved building as a cultural community hub with theatre at its core is well underway.

The theatre is building new multipurpose spaces for wider community and artistic benefit; ensuring it can meet the needs of the communities of Surrey for the next 50 years. Accessibility has already been improved with the addition of new accessible toilets, and there are other exciting changes coming this year.

The project will:

- Improve accessibility throughout the front of house areas including the provision of a lift to all floors.
- Create a multipurpose accessible community room for engagement activities, events, rehearsals and workshops.
- Remodel the theatre's public spaces to make them fit-for-purpose to meet the growing demand for these areas.
- Improve its environmental

sustainability by replacing outdated electrical and mechanical services with energy efficient alternative.

The **Yvonne Arnaud Theatre** is a registered charity and the only producing venue in Surrey. A regional theatre with a national reach and a mission to produce and present vibrant, outstanding, entertaining drama for the communities of Surrey and the South East.

An artistic resource and a safe space for many communities to participate in the thrill and delight of live theatre and arts activities, it enables people of all ages to come together, whether they choose to see a play, take part in a workshop or event, or meet a friend for coffee.

In June 2023 the theatre was delighted to receive £3m from **Surrey County**

Council's Your Fund Surrey, and the team thanked the thousands of people who took the time to write in, make comments and like its application on the Your Fund Surrey website, contacted their Surrey County Council representatives and generally supported the theatre in showing how vital it is to the county, in so many ways.

With the generous support of **Your Fund Surrey** added to the 2.28m
raised to date, the theatre still needs to
generate a further £715,000 in order to
complete the planned works. Please
consider donating to help the theatre
reach their target.

Work is due for completion in the summer, the theatre's 60th anniversary year. To celebrate, the Yvonne Arnaud and **Guildford Shakespeare Company** have partnered for two ambitious and exciting productions running from 10 to 26 July: **The Comedy of Errors** and **A Company of Rascals**. Performed simultaneously on both the Main Stage and in promenade around the theatre, inside and out, this will be an unmissable theatrical event for the town.

The theatre will remain open this spring and summer whilst most of the work is done, and has devised a building programme that still brings you the best in drama, comedy, family shows and entertainment. The new **Riverbank Kitchen** at the rear of the ground floor has now come to life and is open Tuesdays to Saturdays for delicious homemade cakes, light bites and lunches.

Local councillors **George Potter** and **Jane Tyson** write their regular update for Burpham residents:

Speed limit reductions in Burpham and Merrow

After a long wait, a consultation on proposed speed limit reductions for some roads in Burpham and Merrow took place between 29th November 2024 and January 9th 2025! The consultation followed a speed limit review which was initiated last year by George, as your Surrey County Councillor, in response to community requests. London Road crossing installed at Winterhill Way

We're pleased to announce that a new signal pedestrian crossing has been installed on London Road near Winterhill Way (expected to be completed by time of going to press). This crossing will provide a safer route for residents, especially schoolchildren north of New Inn Lane, to access Sainsbury's, the park, and the primary school. While there have been some teething problems with the design of the crossing, we are working with the county council to get these fixed.

Gosden Hill development update

Claire Upton-Brown, Director of Planning at Guildford Borough Council, met with residents at Burpham Village Hall in November to discuss the Gosden Hill development. The event, hosted by the Burpham Community Association, provided an opportunity for residents to share their views and concerns, especially around impacts on traffic,

flooding and healthcare services.

A planning application for the site isn't expected until early 2025, but Claire Upton-Brown left the meeting with a better understanding of residents' concerns and has pledged to have more meetings with residents as the application progresses.

London Road walking and cycling scheme

This is the final update on the scheme. The Surrey County Council Cabinet has voted not to go ahead with the revised scheme through Burpham. This decision was called in for review by a scrutiny committee, who found that the Cabinet's reasons for rejecting the scheme weren't backed up by evidence, and asked the Cabinet to reconsider their decision. However, when the Cabinet next met, the council leader announced they would not reconsider and moved on without discussion or a vote.

While some may welcome this decision, we believe it was a missed opportunity to deliver wider pavements, proper pedestrian crossings, and safe cycle lanes in our community. We will continue working for safer walking and cycling in Burpham and along the London Road.



What is in store for the Guildford property market in 2025?

As far as the property market is concerned, 2024 was a year to largely forget! An election and a budget managed to dampen buyer enthusiasm during the summer and autumn markets, and interest rates didn't drop by as much as was originally thought. However, time is the great healer and we had a slightly stronger finish to the end of the year than we were expecting.

Looking forward to 2025, I suspect we will be very busy in the early spring, dealing with both buyers and sellers who adopted a 'watch & wait' attitude in the second half of 2024. I think prices will remain largely stable, due to borrowing rates not dropping as quickly as expected, and buyers will be discerning – great houses in fantastic spots will perform exceptionally well, but those houses that don't fall into this category will have to be correctly priced in order to attract buyers swiftly.

With these economic conditions, it is imperative that sellers partner up with an agent who has experience in more challenging markets, and that experience only comes with age and longevity! Beware of those agents that shout about how much market share they have - if I were selling, I'd be far more interested in what percentage of their instructions they'd actually sold and whether they'd got the price right or over-valued it to get the business and then had to reduce it multiple times.

Gosden Hill

Martin Grant homes will shortly submit their outline plans for Gosden Hill which were shared with the public in November.

BCA responded to the plan which will create 1800 new homes on the land bounded by the A3, the railway and Merrow Lane (Burpham end). Initial plans include schools, shops and a railway station.

The plan is not without its attractions: it will include a large woodland park in Cotts Wood, ease Guildford's chronic waiting list, and introduce a southbound slip onto the A3 a little way up the A3 at the main access to the estate, and introduce a nearby railway station.

Naturally, our main concern is about the traffic it will bring down adjacent roads as the estate fills up over a 10 year period. 1800 houses means 3400 extra cars which will make their way down London Road to get to the town centre and our shops.

In a last-minute change, the developers added a southern exit at the corner of New Inn Lane and Merrow Lane by the railway arch. Yes, it's already a pinch point. It will only work if they take a very large bite out of the protected woodland next to it and box in the cottages

there. In its favour, it would allow some cars to avoid Burpham altogether if they were heading into Merrow.

The most contentious thing - at least immediately - is that construction traffic looks set to go up existing roads - that's London Road (adjacent to current slip road). New Inn Lane and Merrow Lane during the first phase of building. If you know these roads, you will understand why we find this unacceptable.



We have other concerns which will crystallise as plans become more detailed. Most of them involve securing adequate infrastructure to take onboard the extra demand for local services, school places and health care, and upgrading pipes and cables careful for the extra sewage, water demands, drainage, energy and so on. Like every other community association before us, we say:

Infrastructure in place first, please.

Update: London Road and Boxgrove Roundabout

The proposals for the London

Road Active Travel Scheme have

been in play since the large public meeting at George Abbot School in January 2023.

Finally, it seems to be settled after safety considerations were felt too difficult to resolve:

- To proceed with the redesigned Boxgrove roundabout to make it safer for cyclists and pedestrians;
- Not proceed with the segregated cycle lanes from Boxgrove to York Road:
- Not to proceed with the segregated cycle lanes and additional pedestrian crossings between New Inn Lane and Boxgrove roundabout.

The Cabinet of Surrey County Council reconsidered its controversial at the Cabinet meeting in November, and upheld the decisions listed above.

Although we are relieved that a decision has been reached, we do think there is work to do to fix the on potholed, puddled and overgrown pavements, and we will relay this message to the council.

Winterhill Farm

Moira MacQuaide's history of Burpham

As we're now into the winter season, let's look at the history of the Winterhill estate.

The first mention of a similar name was in 1276 when Adam le Dispenser gave


Burgham Manor to William de Wintershull and his wife.

Could that have been the origin of the name of the farm? The family were Lords of the Manor of Burpham for over 200 vears. The first time that Winterhill Farm appeared on a map was in 1823, marked as Winter Hill Bottom. The Tithe Map of 1838 showed the extent of the farmland. from almost opposite the Sutton Place Lodge gates (now on the A3) in the north, down to New Inn Lane in the south. Bordered by London Road on one side and Merrow Parish on the other. The land was owned by Lord Onslow and occupied by William Smallpiece, apart from one small plot occupied by the Rev. George Bethell, who was Rector of Worplesdon Parish. The farmhouse, which is believed to have been demolished after World War II. was located where Oak Tree Close is now. Does anyone have a photo of the farmhouse?

On the Tithe Map of 1838, there were two fields and a wood with the name Upfolds – now Upfolds Green, off Glendale Drive. On the 1895 and 1912 OS maps, the bottom right-hand corner of the farmland has become Brick Fields,

with two kilns, sheds and offices. The maps show a pond there, currently hidden behind trees at the corner of New Inn Lane and Merrow Lane. The brick works seemed to cease business around the time of World War I. The 1912 OS map showed the bottom left-hand side of the farmland as orchard, and records show that Hugh

Lancelot Robson ran the Guildford Fruit Farm there (previous article about this in March 2024). The orchard didn't appear in the Tithe Map of 1838, so must have been planted in later years.

The farmland was sold for housing development, first advertised by Armstrongs Estates Ltd in 1934. Described as 'Charming', prices ranged from £700 to £950, and buyers could choose from seven designs. The Guildford City Outlook magazine in 1934 said "Delay not, or you may be too late!" in their advert for the estate. Orchard Road, Winterhill Way, Briar Way and Hawthorne Way were built first, then Great Oaks Park, linking Gosden Hill Road with London Road. In 1935 the Glendale Estate was advertised which "enjoys most delightful surroundings amidst a background of fine trees".

Winterhill Farm was still, in parts, a working dairy farm until around 1934, but then development took over and now the only green space is Upfolds Green.

Unlocking the power of our mind

Imagine if we were born with a handbook on how to make the most of our miraculous brains. I often wonder how many of us feel we have maximised our potential during our lifetimes.



In a former church where I worked, it was only once we removed furniture and allowed space on a carpet that we saw the beauty of light shining through stained glass to leave a stunning multi-coloured view on the carpet, so we could see the enormous gift that change had brought.

It is only in the past few weeks as we survey the change in the frontage at St Luke's church that we begin to notice those changes and consequences. When we decided that we needed to remove two enormous conifers from the graveyard, we set about the process thinking that we needed to be good stewards to our buildings and grounds, so removing large trees before they risked falling in high winds, or root structures disturbing graves or the main church building itself.

But we want to replace them with something new – to create habitats for wildlife, to increase biodiversity in the graveyard and to plant new life there that will flourish and enhance the space that we have temporarily vacated. Yet, it struck me the other day as someone asked me: 'now that we can see the church much more visibly, and light has obviously increased outside, do you notice the light increase inside?'

Great question, I thought, and it began to make me wonder about the other unintended consequences both good and bad from doing something we all still feel was the right change to make.

For starters, we have noticed a decrease in the number of pigeons alighting on the roof. We have found a number of graves that had been hitherto consumed by the large trees – each has a family connection and a story we long to embark on hearing. The new view and from the front has meant we have a more logical fire assembly point by the railings on the side where the trees were.

One of the great gifts I was given on arrival, was a set of cards from Gillian Hughes, whose painting is on this page, of St. Luke's. In the picture, the conifers are rather junior, but the picture captures the whole of the South side.

Now that the conifers are down, we can

see the South side again from the road, the path and the park, so it begins to offer a sight of the church again. What Gillian managed to capture was the remarkable light bathing that South side, and the warmth that this brings just in looking outside the building. As the question came to me about light shining inside the building, I recognise that the warmth will accompany the light also – and that warmth comes also from the welcome all will receive.

As has been mentioned before, it is my dream to open the church up again more regularly – we delighted in hosting a number of services in there during the Autumn, and will do regularly in the Spring – starting with a midweek communion at Wednesday lunchtime. Come and see the light shining in the darkness, and feel the warmth – come and look outwards from within.

Gardening hints and tips for January & February

- January and early February are a good time for the winter pruning of apples and pears (non-stone fruit) and for making sure that any fallen leaves or old stems of herbaceous perennials don't smother emerging bulbs or winter bedding.
- It is also the time for winter pruning of Wisteria where stems are cut back stems to two or three buds. Also prune other climbers such as Virginia creeper, ivy, Campsis, winter-flowering jasmine, and the

- late-flowering Clematis ones that flower on the new season's growth.
- Bare rooted roses, shrubs, hedging, and some trees can also be planted now through to end of February. Bare-rooted plants without a pot or soil are a very cost-effective way to buy new plants.
- Start to tidy beds and borders, especially as snowdrops and early spring plants start to emerge.
- In the vegetable garden, continue to harvest winter veg such as brassicas, parsnips, and any remaining carrots, then either dig over any vacant plots incorporating well-rotted manure or compost into beds that will be growing potatoes, brassicas, and legumes, or simply layer the beds with compost and allow the worms to incorporate it. Do not add manure to beds for root vegetables.
- Late January and February is the start of the seed sowing season if you have somewhere warm and light. Seeds that need a long growing season such as chillies, or

- even some lettuce and salad crops can be started early.

 However, don't be in too much of a rush to start most tender annuals they will often become pale and drawn (etiolated) unless they have lots of artificial light.
- Seed potatoes can be chitted in February – arrange them end-up in a tray or in old egg boxes and keep them in a cool but light area for short stubby shoots to grow from the 'eyes'.
- Ventilate greenhouses on warmer or sunnier days if you are overwintering plants or perhaps give it a pre-Spring clean inside and out and ensure that the glass is clean to allow as much light in as possible.
- Dahlia tubers and Lily and Dutch Iris bulbs can also be started back into life under cover in late February.
- Finally, as January and February can often be the coldest time of the year, spare a thought for garden birds and put some food and water out they will repay you later in the season by eating lots of the pests in your garden.


