



North Guildford Food Bank's fundraising campaign launches with support of leading singer & songwriter, Liz Simcock.



North Guildford Food Bank, which was established in 2012 to provide urgent assistance to local people in crisis, is launching a fundraising campaign to address the increasing surge in demand.

Leading singer & songwriter,
Liz Simcock, has pledged her support
with a concert at Holy Trinity Church
in the High Street on Saturday 13th
July at 7.30pm.

Performing as part of the **Guildford Fringe Festival**, the concert is an opportunity to raise awareness of the need, and also raise funds from the proceeds of the ticket sales. Liz

Simcock is one of the country's finest singer/songwriters and her highly personal autobiographical songs are injected with poetry, emotion and splashes of humour.

The Food Bank, which is based at St Clare's church in Park Barn, has been helping individuals and families in need for the last decade. However, it has noticed a sharp increase in need over the last few months as people struggle with the cost of living crisis.

In February, **The Trussell Trust**, the UK charity which campaigns to stop food hunger, conducted **YouGov** research which highlighted that 780,000 people claiming Universal Credit have been forced to use food banks (Dec 23/24) and more than half (55%) ran out of food in the last month and couldn't afford more. In the last three months, 22% of people claiming Universal Credit were unable to cook hot food as they couldn't afford to use their oven or other utilities. Whilst Guildford is seen as an affluent town, there are pockets of deprivation and need which can often go unseen.

One very grateful recipient of food parcels wrote to the Food Bank recently: "I collected my first food parcel today after having to give up my job to care for my son who has health issues. Being a single mum and generally not being able to cope financially, food has become a luxury. Tonight we are both going to bed with full stomachs for the first time in what feels like forever... I honestly cannot thank you all enough and all the people who have donated food also. The volunteers were so all incredibly kind and made a situation which brings out a lot of feelings of shame and failure SO much easier."

Volunteer and concert organiser, Melanie Simcock, says, "We are very thankful for the donations of food we receive via contributions at local super-

markets, churches, schools and other local organisations and from individuals as well as those who make financial donations to us. Sadly however we are finding for the first time that the need is outstripping the supply. The concert will help us raise valuable funds to support our work and will also help raise awareness of the need that exists in the town."

The Food Bank not only provides a warm welcome for those collecting food parcels, but also delivers to those who are housebound. Clients often face a myriad of complex needs, and the volunteers are able to help signpost clients to other support.

As a **Safer Neighbourhoods Team** officer. I am always keen to engage with local communities to find out about local issues/ concerns, monitor the effectiveness of existing police interventions and simply provide a police presence within the area. The Policing Vision 2025 emphasises the importance of physical police presences within local communities, which I believe is very important in providing opportunities for police-public engagement and for police officers to develop better knowledge of their areas. So, if you ever see an officer out on patrol within Burpham, please

feel free to come and chat with us!

In terms of crime within Burpham, as a town it has fewer crime occurrences compared to other Guildford areas and the national average. However, this does not mean by any means that it is not worth police attention and patrol. In fact, it makes our role as Safer Neighbourhood officers even more integral in establishing local concerns and issues before they have the potential to escalate into crimes. We therefore encourage residents to not hesitate in contacting Surrey Police via the relevant channels to report any incidents, so that it can be designated to police attention as quickly as possible.



Across the East of Guildford, we are concerned with numerous incidents of fraud tradesmen attempting to persuade residents to let them do work on their property, before then charging them an extortionate amount of money. This is a topic we will be aiming to conduct community engagement events about in and around Guildford, so please look out for those advertised in due course. In the meantime, we remind you to never accept DIY work from tradesmen or alike businesses that come to your home who cannot prove their identity, and never pay them in cash.

In terms of reporting non-emergency crimes, as well as phoning 101 or using their Live Chat function via their website, www.surrey.police.uk, Surrey Police also offers a reporting platform via Facebook Messenger. Prevention is Better than Cure: Stay Safe in the Sun

As the summer holidays approach and many of us are looking forward to enjoying the sun, whether here at home or in warmer climates, we thought it would be helpful to share some tips on keeping our skin healthy. We've reached out to **Sophia Wyatt**, an ambassador for '**Skcin**' (the skin cancer charity) and owner of a skin clinic in Send, to get her expert advice.

Skin cancer rates are rising faster than any other cancer, with melanoma, the deadliest form, becoming one of the most common cancers in 15-34 year-olds. The encouraging news is that over 80% of skin cancers are preventable. By following five simple steps and being sun savvy, we can almost entirely avoid skin cancer, underscoring the importance of taking sun safety seriously.

We all enjoy the sun for its mood-lifting benefits and essential role in vitamin D synthesis, but it's crucial to enjoy it safely to prevent skin damage. This damage ranges from premature aging to skin cancer. Alarmingly, a single case of severe sunburn in childhood or adolescence can more than double the risk of developing melanoma later in life. Therefore, the key message is to be aware, practice sun safety, and avoid burning.

Look after your skin – stay safe in the sun!

It's not just sunbathing that puts you at risk; any time spent in the sun without adequate protection can be harmful. If you frequently participate in outdoor hobbies or sports or work outdoors, your risk increases. Always use the Five S's of Sun Safety and never burn!

The Five S's of Sun Safety:

- 1 SLIP on a T-shirt
- 2 SLOP on SPF 30+ broad-spectrum UVA sunscreen
- 3 SLAP on a broad-brimmed hat
- 4 SLIDE on quality sunglasses
- 5 **SHADE** from the sun whenever possible

1 Slip on a t-shirt

- UV-protective clothing is one of the best defenses against the sun's UV rays.
- Wear clothing that covers as much skin as possible, particularly the shoulders, which can easily burn.
- Choose garments with a tight weave for better protection.
- High UPF (Ultraviolet Protection Factor) rated fabrics provide the best defense.

2 Slop on SPF 30+ sunscreen

- No sunscreen offers complete protection; do not rely on it alone.
- Always use a broad-spectrum sunscreen with an SPF of 30 or above, preferably water-resistant.
- Ensure it carries a UVA symbol or has at least a 4-star rating.
- Store sunscreen in a cool, accessible place and check the expiry date.

- Apply generously to clean, dry, exposed skin 20 minutes before going outdoors and reapply once outdoors.
- Reapply at least every two hours, more often if swimming or sweating.
- Protect your lips with an SPF 30+ lip balm.

3 Slap on a broad-brimmed hat

- Wear a hat with a wide brim that shades your face, neck, and ears.
- Legionnaire hats (with a neck flap) or bucket hats (with a 7.5cm brim) are most effective.
- Choose hats with a tight weave or UPF-rated fabric.
- Avoid baseball caps as they do not protect the ears and neck.

4 Slide on quality sunglasses

- UV radiation can damage the eyes, so wearing quality sunglasses is crucial.
- Look for sunglasses with the European CE mark for safe protection.
- High EPF (Eye Protection Factor) rated sunglasses offer the best protection.
- Ensure they fit well and wrap around to prevent UV rays from entering from the sides or top.

 The price and darkness of the lens do not correlate with the level of UV protection.

5 Shade from the sun when possible

 Seek shade whenever possible, especially between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. when UV rays are strongest.

 Keep babies and toddlers in the shade at all times.

 Use shade in conjunction with other protective measures for optimal protection. By incorporating these sun safety practices into your daily routine, you can significantly reduce the risk of skin damage and skin cancer. GASP Motor Project

A dynamic, forward-thinking education charity based near Guildford.

From its origins in 2005 providing evening activities for local youngsters who had been engaging in anti-social behaviour including car theft and joyriding, **GASP** quickly expanded to deliver daytime sessions in motor mechanics, registering as a charity in 2009.

This year GASP support over 500 youngsters across Surrey, including at several local schools such as **Guildford County**, **Kings College** and **George Abbot**. The charity runs 35 courses a week and two evening youth clubs, at its main workshop near Albury and via three fully-equipped mobile vans. Demand for GASP's services is unprecedented.

Children referred to the charity have often been out of mainstream education for several years. They may be permanently excluded, school refusers, or involved in criminal activities.

GASP provides a safe learning space where progress is made at each individual's pace. With a maximum

group of six youngsters with two GASP tutors, learning is personalised, tutors being positive role models. Its fantastic workshop has all the professional equipment of a commercial garage including a car lift, industrial compressor, engine hoists and bench press.

All activities are linked to **AQA** unit awards; students earn certificates for skills accomplished, creating portfolios to demonstrate their commitment and achievements to schools, parents, peers and future employers.

Activities are 'hands-on', involving teamwork, problem solving and communication – building positive wellbeing and self-confidence. Students learn about two and four wheeled vehicles and two and four stroke engines. They examine quad and pit bikes, learning about engine capacity, gears and braking systems. They gain practical skills including how to change a wheel and basic car maintenance.

GASP's courses help youngsters who do not fit the traditional model of education, enhancing their sense of self-worth. Every participant can make a new start, and see themselves in a different light, as 'achievers with huge potential' rather than feeling discarded and demotivated. Many start to make positive life choices.

With increasing demand for GASP courses, experienced motor mechanics and engineers are needed to join the team. **Teaching experience** is not necessary. For further information please email: admin@gaspmotorproject.org



People are, on the whole, social beings. We enjoy getting together with others of like mind to do a wide range of things, including sports. Over the years, Burpham has had many clubs, societies and organisations, all offering various activities for those who live in the area.

Some met in pubs, some in village or church halls, some in dedicated sports venues. The oldest club found in the Surrey History Centre records was for the **Burpham String Band**, proved by a membership card that had been printed in the 1890s. It was still going in 1905, but had been re-named the **Worplesdon String Band**. I wonder what happened to that?

Burpham Village Hall was built in 1922, and in the early days was used by the Women's Institute and the Mothers' Union for meetings. Strong drink was not allowed, although this was changed to let wedding parties enjoy sherry and champagne! The Church of the Holy Spirit hall on New

Inn Lane, built in 1961, has provided facilities for **Brownies** and **Guides**, as well as the very popular **Drop-in Club** for pensioners in the parish.

Mrs Bidwell ran a Scout group at one time, but it seems that today Merrow is the place for **Cubs** and **Scouts**.

Today, one of the biggest users of the village hall is **Guildford u3a**, a self-help learning and social organisation for those no longer in full-time employment. Group meetings include local history, digital living, genealogy, language groups, music, philosophy and many others.

The WI, which started in Canada, moved to Britain in 1915, and Burpham opened its own WI in 1931 as an afternoon group. They enjoyed wide-ranging activities and talks, and in 1936 were reported in the news to have decided, after a debate, "that married women have a better time than single women". Such organisations rely on volunteers to make things happen, and the afternoon WI group closed down in 1991 as they were unable to find a Treasurer. However. in 1989 the Burpham Evening WI group was set up, and is still thriving today - a lively group, which provides for a range of interests for Burpham ladies. Other clubs for ladies have been the Burpham Ladies Club and the Burpham Women's Guild.

Burpham Garden Club started in about 1960 and ran two shows a year, with trophies awarded for the best-kept summer front garden. John Boon keeps residents informed about gardening issues in each issue of Burpham Pages.

Burpham Community Association was set up in 1973 and represents the community whenever there are matters of general concern, or needs to bring issues to public attention. It liaises with the local MP, borough and county councillors, on topics such as flooding, traffic, drainage, and protection of amenities. Again, more information

in each issue of Burpham Pages. Burpham Neighbourhood Forum was the first community to prepare its own neighbourhood plan, which has been adopted by the borough development plan.

Burpham Church runs several youth activities, but 60 years ago there was just Sunday School to look forward to. Then there are all the sporting organisations in Burpham. Football, for both adults and juniors, Tennis, Bowling, Table Tennis, and Darts. All have been popular in the last 70 years. With all this going on, there should be no complaints about boredom in Burpham!



John Boon gives us the low down on what needs to be done in the garden in July & August.

Things to do in the garden in July.

- Remove the main stem of Cordon Tomatoes just above the fourth truss, any fruit that forms above this truss is unlikely to ripen before winter sets in.
- Spray Potatoes and Tomatoes when it is wet and muggy to reduce the risk of blight damage.
- A regular feed of Tomorite will help Tomatoes and Dahlias to produce good fruit and flowers, start feeding Tomatoes as soon as the first fruit starts to set, do not water at irregular times as this will encourage blossom end rot in the fruit.
- Continue to make successional sowings of Salad Crops
- Regularly pick Courgettes unless you wish the fruit to become Marrows.
- French and Runner Beans will become tough and stringy unless they are picked frequently.
- Spring Cabbage, Turnip and a final batch of French and Runner Beans should now be sown outdoors. Leeks and Winter Brassicas should be planted out this month.

- Give Summer Bedding Plants and containerised plants a regular Liquid feed.
- Dead head Bedding Plants to maintain a colourful display and Perennials to obtain a second flush of bloom.
- Once containerised Camellias and Rhododendrons have finished flowering keep them well watered to enable good flowering next year.

Things to do in the garden in August.

Now that all the hard work has been done it is time to sit back and to enjoy your garden. which should now be at the peak of perfection.

Set the mower blades on high when cutting the grass during dry periods.

- Continue to harvest fast growing Vegetables and Salad crops as they mature.
- Keep Runner Beans well watered which will help the flowers to set.
- 💊 Increase the feeding of Tomatoes.
- Number of the Lift Maincrop Potatoes.

- Rambling Roses which only flower once a year should be pruned after flowering, cutting out one in three stems from the base to encourage new growth.
- Summer prune Wisteria, removing all new shoots to five buds above the main stem.
- Now is the time to take cuttings of Buddleia, Hydrangea and Pyracantha.
- Cut back Perennials which have collapsed onto the lawn, path or other plants.
- Now is the time to set Earwig traps amongst your Dahlias, fill a 3" pot with hay or straw and place it upside down on the end of the cane supporting the plant, the Earwigs will climb into the pot during the night and will be waiting for you to shake them out into a dish in the morning for disposal.
- This month you can start collecting seed from Annuals ready for sowing next Spring, do not collect the seed of F1 hybrids as they will not produce flowers true to type next year.
- Set the mower blades on high when cutting the grass during dry periods.
